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County Road 29 Closure August 17-September 18, 2009

(Woodland, CA) – County Road (CR) 29, between CR 99 and State Route 113, will be closed to traffic from August 17 to September 18, 2009 for reconstruction and widening. After construction, the new road will have two 11-foot wide travel lanes and two new 5-foot wide bicycle lanes.

CR 99D from CR 29 to the Davis city limit will also be widened to include two 11-foot wide travel lanes and two new five (5) foot wide bicycle lanes.

This construction will complete the final link of the Davis-Woodland bikeway by providing a 5-foot wide bicycle lane on each side of the road (on CR 99D, CR 29 and CR 99) between Davis and the Woodland city limit. A detour route will be posted to direct traffic around the closed section.

The existing materials will be recycled in place by “full depth recycling,” an environmentally sensitive practice which rebuilds worn out asphalt pavement by recycling 100 percent of the existing roadway. Old asphalt and base materials are pulverized using a specialized machine called a reclaimer. On top of the pulverized material, water is added to reach the optimal moisture content for compaction and then dry cement is incorporated for stabilization. A reclaimer is used again to mix all the materials. After shaping and grading, the new base is compacted to produce a strong, durable base for an asphalt surface.

This method recycles the materials in place, so there is no need to haul in aggregate or haul out old material for disposal. FDR with cement saves money while preserving natural resources by using existing materials and conserving virgin aggregates. The road performance is improved through better stabilization, building a stronger, low-maintenance road that will last for many years.
