Subject: Extension of Streambed Alteration Agreement Number R2-2002-251

Dear Mr. Schwartz:

The Department received your June 28, 2007 request to extend Streambed Alteration Agreement Number R2-2002-251 beyond the August 30, 2007 expiration date specified in the agreement. The Agreement pertains to several projects within the stream zone of Cache Creek. Activities within Cache Creek include tamarisk and arundo removal, minor streambank erosion repair and a significant erosion repair project at Huffs Corner. This letter acknowledges the following:

- 1. The revised expiration date is December 31, 2007. This provision applies to those activities listed in the June 29, 2007 correspondence to the Department.
- 2. No additional projects and/or activities authorized by the original agreement shall begin unless those activities can be completed by October 31, 2007.
- 3. The time period for completing the work within the stream zone of Cache Creek shall be restricted to periods of low stream flow and dry weather. Construction activities within the stream zone shall be completed prior to October 31 unless otherwise authorized by the Department. Construction activities shall cease until all reasonable erosion control measures have been implemented prior to all storm events. No work will occur during wet weather. Wet Weather is defined as when there has been 1/4" inch of rain in a 24-hour period. In addition, no work will occur during a dry out period of 24 hours after the above referenced wet weather. Revegetation, restoration and placement and/or maintenance of erosion control materials work is not confined to this time period.
- 4. All of the conditions listed in the original agreement are still binding;
- 5. A copy of this letter and a copy of the original agreement must be readily available at project work sites. When requested by any Department representative or agency with Inspection authority, this letter and original agreement must be presented.
