## **Davis Branch Library hosts Digital Bookmobile March 26 to Kick-Off Yolo County Library's New Digital Download Service**

(Woodland, CA) – On March 26, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., the Mary L. Stephens Davis Branch Library, located at 2801 Second Street in Davis, will host OverDrive, Inc.'s Digital Bookmobile – an immersive download experience inside a high-tech tractor-trailer – to kick off the Yolo County Library's new digital download service. Readers of all ages are invited to engage in digital downloading in the Digital Bookmobile through interactive demonstrations, and to experience Yolo County Library's new audiobook, eBook, music and video download service at this free event. Beginning on this same day, Yolo County Library card-holders will be able to check out and download digital titles from the comfort of their homes at any time by visiting: [www.yolocountylibrary.org](http://www.yolocountylibrary.org).

“This new product offers a wide range of materials for all ages, available with just a library card and Internet access,” said Yolo County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman Helen M. Thomson. “Our new download service expands the library's ability to reach more people. Customers can download movies, books, music and more from the comfort of their homes.”

The Digital Bookmobile, owned and operated by OverDrive, Inc., is housed inside an 18-wheel tractor-trailer. This 74-foot, community outreach vehicle is a high-tech update of the traditional bookmobile that has served communities for decades. The vehicle is equipped with broadband Internet-connected computers, high definition monitors, premium sound systems, and a variety of portable media players, all of which help visitors explore Yolo County Library's download service. Interactive learning stations give visitors an opportunity to search the library's digital media collection, use supported mobile devices and sample eBooks, audiobooks, music and video.

Beginning on March, 26, public library patrons can take advantage of the download service any time by visiting the library's Web site ([www.yolocountylibrary.org](http://www.yolocountylibrary.org)). From there, they can browse the growing collection of best-selling, newly released and classic titles, and check out a digital title with a valid library card. Once downloaded, digital titles can be enjoyed on a computer or transferred to supported mobile devices. Many audio titles can also be burned to audio compact disk. At the end of the lending period, titles will automatically expire and are returned to the digital collection, so there are no late fees or damaged items.
