## Judge Reinstates Gang Injunction Against Broderick Boys

Woodland, CA — December 30, 2007 — A Yolo County Superior Court Judge has re-issued a permanent injunction against specific members of the Broderick Boys criminal street gang operating in West Sacramento, CA. Judge Timothy Fall issued the permanent injunction against nine Broderick Boys gang members on December 19, 2007. The court order creates a "Safety Zone" in the City of West Sacramento in which the named members are prohibited from associating with other gang members in public, trespassing, possessing weapons, possessing graffiti tools, possessing drugs and/or alcohol and/or intimidating witnesses. The named members are also subject to a curfew within the Safety Zone from 10 p.m. until sunrise.

A hearing to determine if a similar preliminary injunction should be issued against other Broderick Boys gang members, and the gang as an independent entity, is currently set for January 31, 2008, at 9:00 a.m. in Department 7 of the Yolo County Superior Court.

Previously, in April of this year, an appellate court overturned a similar injunction against the Broderick Boys because of technical defects it found in the legal procedure used to sue the gang as an "unincorporated association." The court also noted that, under the circumstances of the case, the notice given to the gang was not sufficient. This most recent injunction is a result of an amended civil lawsuit filed against members of the Broderick Boys gang by the Yolo County District Attorney on behalf of the City of West Sacramento. Unlike the previous court order, this new gang injunction names specific individual gang members, all of whom were given legal notice of the action and the opportunity to contest it in court.

In commenting on the new injunction, District Attorney Jeff Reisig stated: "It is impossible to ignore the devastating impact gang activity has in our communities. An effective response must focus on prevention, intervention, education and enforcement. In the big picture, gang injunctions are merely part of this equation. However, when sanctioned and monitored by the courts, gang injunctions are a lawful and powerful tool that responsible civic leaders should consider in appropriate situations. By persistently pursuing this case, City leaders have demonstrated their commitment to public safety in West Sacramento."

#### IT IS ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that:

1. Defendant Victor Dazo is enjoined and restrained from engaging in or performing directly or indirectly, any of the following activities in the Safety Zone

Do Not Associate: Standing, sitting, walking, driving, gathering or appearing, anywhere in 4 a. public view or anyplace accessible to the public, with any known member of the Broderick Boys including but 5 not limited to Timothy Acuna (Cartoon), Thomas Cedillo, Alex Estrada (Otter), Ramon Esquilin (Kiko), 6 7 Jesse Garcia (Smokey), Michael Hernandez (Snoopy), Rainey Martinez, William Mcfadden (Billy), Robert Montoya (Little Rob), Michael Morales, Rudy Ornelas, Guillermo Duke Rosales (Duke), Robert Sanchez 8 9 (Rabbit), Paul Savala (Savage), Rudy Tafoya (Rude Dog), Abel Trevino (Gangster), Felipe Valadez Jr. 10 (Shug), Billy Wolfington (Bouncer), and Tyson Ybarra, but not including: (1) when all individuals are inside a school attending class or on school business, and (2) when all individuals are inside a church; provided 11 12 however that this prohibition against associating shall apply to all claims of travel to or from any of those 13 locations;

b. No Intimidation: Confronting, intimidating, annoying, harassing, threatening, challenging,
provoking, assaulting or battering any person known to be a witness to any activity of the Broderick Boys gang,
known to be a victim of any activity of the Broderick Boys, or known to be a person who has complained
about any activity of the Broderick Boys;

c. No Guns or Dangerous Weapons: Anywhere in public view or anyplace accessible to the
 public, (1) possessing any gun, ammunition, or illegal weapon as defined in Penal Code section 12020, (2)
 knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone who is in possession of such gun, ammunition or dangerous
 weapon, or (3) knowingly remaining in the presence of such gun, ammunition or dangerous weapon;

d. No Graffiti or Graffiti Tools: Damaging, defacing, or marking any public property or private
property of another, or possessing any spray paint can, felt tip marker, or other graffiti tool as defined in Penal
Code section 594.2;

e. Stay Away From Drugs: Without a prescription, (1) selling, possessing, or using any
controlled substance or related paraphernalia, including but not limited to rolling papers and pipes used for
illegal drug use, (2) knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone selling, possessing, or using any controlled
substance or such related paraphernalia, or (3) knowingly remaining in the presence of any controlled substance

1 or such related paraphernalia;

f. Stay Away From Alcohol: Anywhere in public view or anyplace accessible to the public,
(1) possessing an open container of an alcoholic beverage, (2) knowingly remaining in the presence of anyone
possessing an open container of an alcoholic beverage, or (3) knowingly remaining in the presence of an open
container of an alcoholic beverage;

g. Obey Curfew: Loitering in any place which is open to the public or exposed to public view
and includes streets, sidewalks, bridges, alleys, plazas, parks, driveways, parking lots, automobiles, and
buildings open to the general public, including those which serve food or drink, or provide entertainment, and
the doorways and entrances to buildings or dwellings and the grounds enclosing them, between the hours of
10:00 p.m. on any day and sunrise the following day;

h. No Trespassing: Being present on or in any property not open to the general public, except
(1) with the prior written consent of the owner, owner's agent, or the person in lawful possession of the
property, or (2) in the presence of and with the voluntary consent of the owner, owner's agent, or the person
in lawful possession of the property; and

i. Obey All Laws: Failing to obey all laws (1) which prohibit violence and threatened violence
 including murder, rape, robbery by force or fear, assault and battery, (2) which prohibit interference with the
 property rights of others including trespass, theft, driving or taking a vehicle without the owner's consent, and
 vandalism, or (3) which prohibit the commission of acts which create a nuisance including the illegal sale of
 controlled substances and blocking the sidewalk.
