

YOLO COUNTY Mental Health Services Act

Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Projects Reassignment Agreement

May 14, 2010

Background:

Attached and presented here for stakeholder review and comment is a two-page document entitled Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Programs Assignment Agreement. The purpose of this agreement is threefold:

- To notify the California Department of Mental Health (DMH) of Yolo County's intention to join CalMHSA, a Joint Powers Authority comprised of several counties throughout California, so that these counties may act in concert to implement Statewide Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Programs;
- Second, to direct DMH to reassign Yolo County's PEI Statewide Programs funding and to contract with CalMHSA to administer the funding and implement the statewide programs; and
- To release five percent (5%) of Yolo County's PEI statewide programs funding allocation to CalMHSA to support its administration of these programs.

Pursuant to DMH Information Notice No. 08-25 issued in 2008 (see http://www.dmh.ca.gov/DMHDocs/2008 Notices.asp), Yolo County assigned its PEI Statewide Programs funding to DMH on February 25, 2009; however, the state has been delayed in its implementation of these programs. Although Yolo County cannot reverse the assignment of these funds to DMH made in 2009, the state recently issued DMH Information Notice No. 10-05, "Assignment of Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Funds for PEI Statewide Programs," making it possible for counties who had assigned funds to DMH to now direct DMH to contract with CalMHSA to administer the PEI Statewide Programs. In order for the statewide PEI programs to go forward, counties are directed by Information Notice No. 10-05 to choose one or more of the following options to expend the PEI statewide funds:

- 1. The county may act jointly with one or more other counties to implement a project through the CalMHSA Joint Powers Authority;
- 2. The county may act jointly with one or more other counties to implement a statewide program through a multi-county collaborative;
- 3. The county may assign funds to the California Department of Mental Health to implement a statewide program.

Specifically, under the first option above, counties may direct the California Department of Mental Health to execute a contract with CalMHSA for administration of the PEI statewide programs. Counties like Yolo, that have previously assigned their PEI statewide funding under the previous information notice, must affirmatively re-assign their funding under the new information notice and may also direct the assignment of five percent (5%) of the funds for planning. Yolo County has chosen to exercise Option 1 under this information notice.

Kim Suderman, Director of Yolo County Department of Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health, is confident that Yolo County will benefit from these statewide projects through training and technical assistance, enhanced state and local partnerships, coordinated regional efforts, research and evaluation, statewide quality improvement activities, and more. Further, if Yolo

County is to benefit from these statewide funds, they must be assigned for statewide use; the funds cannot be used for any other purposes. It is therefore the intention of Yolo County Department of Alcohol, Drug and Mental Health, at the conclusion of the 30-day public review and comment period, absent sound objections from our stakeholders, to submit the attached Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Programs Assignment Agreement to the California Department of Mental Health and to join the CalMHSA Joint Powers Authority.

Documentation of the local review process:

Commencing May 14, 2010 and ending at 5:00 p.m. on June 14, 2010, the Supplemental MHSA PEI Statewide Programs Assignment Agreement for Yolo County was posted for 30-day public review and comment on the county's website: http://www.yolocounty.org/Index.aspx?page=993.

Paper copies of the document were sent to all public libraries in Yolo County, with the request that the document be made available for public viewing at the resource desk during regular hours of operation.

Paper copies of the document were delivered to mental health service centers in Woodland, Davis and West Sacramento, and to the Department of Social Services "One-Stop" center in Woodland.

The stakeholder community was notified of the public posting and public review process by e-mail to all interested parties and by the publishing of announcements in the Woodland Daily Democrat and the Davis Enterprise, local newspapers with daily circulation.

To facilitate public comment, copies of the *Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) 30-Day Public Comment Form* were attached to this document. Public comment received is summarized and/or attached as follows: [pending]

Pursuant to WIC 5892(a)(3) assigned funds intended to fund a contract between DMH and CalMHSA may be distributed to CalMHSA only after a PEI Statewide Program and Expenditure Plan or update has been approved by the MHSOAC.
