There is a crisis for the most vulnerable elderly in Yolo County. Between budget and program cuts and the wave of baby boomers on the horizon Yolo County will be challenged in unprecedented ways and needs to better prepare to provide a safe and supportive environment for our aging residents. At this summit, community leaders and organizations will take a comprehensive look at the current situation and develop an action plan for what is needed. The goal is to identify gaps in services, build collaborations, develop advocacy points and begin the process of designing an action plan for Yolo County.

"With the rising demand for services by a growing number of seniors in Yolo County, we are going to need to plan an effective response to care for some of our most vulnerable citizens," said Yolo County Supervisor Jim Provenza. "This is our chance to work together to find some real solutions."
