October is Crime Prevention Month

(Woodland, CA) Yolo County District Attorney Jeff Reisig announced today that, in conjunction with the national observance of 'Crime Prevention Month' in October, the District Attorney's Office will be providing the community with information about preventing crime.

Since 1984, October has been designated as National Crime Prevention Month. Members of local, state and national law enforcement make special efforts to educate and alert the community about how to recognize, report and reduce crime in their neighborhoods. Experience has shown that grassroots, collaborative action to support law enforcement works to keep crime down. For example: by keeping your Social Security card safe at home, instead of in your wallet, you lower the chance of becoming a victim of Identity Theft.

Each week, during the month of October, information from different divisions of the District Attorney's Office will be made available through press releases, community outreach and social network sites like Facebook and Twitter. Information and tips will run the gamut and include how to protect you and your family members from telephone scams, home invasion robbery, insurance fraud and being overcharged at the store.

District Attorney Jeff Reisig believes that our citizens should be made aware of how they can reduce the chances of crime happening to them. Many simple ideas like removing valuables from the car and locking your doors at home truly make a difference and take a bite out of crime.
