 - > FMAP extension was passed
 - MHSA \$ no longer up for cuts, other cuts have been legitimized because counties have MHSA
- Question asked—Is there a plan in place by the County for when cash flow runs out?
 - ➤ County Auditor utilized a short-term borrowing method—TRAN which must be paid back at the end of the year. The County is okay for now.
