Yolo County Library Summer Reading Programs – with Prizes!

(Woodland, CA) – The Yolo County Library is rolling out its popular summer reading program on June 1, running through mid-August. The Summer Reading Program includes free reading clubs at all branch libraries and prizes for all ages. One World, Many Stories is for children, ages 0-12. Children who check in at their branch library's Information Desk six times during the summer to share what they have been reading will get a prize each time. In addition, programs will be available allowing them to visit Pakistan, Alaska and other far away places around the world without leaving their home towns. Each child who completes the program will receive a free paperback book and pizza coupon from Round Table Pizza.

You are Here is for teens, ages 13-18. Teens who fill out a short survey will be entered into a system-wide raffle for a chance to win a flip camera or a Target gift certificate. In addition, participants who read and review books will be entered into a raffle for branch prizes. The more books read and reviewed, the more chances to win.

Novel Destinations is for adults. Adults who share their book recommendations with the library will be entered into a drawing for a fun prize. The library will post reviews anonymously so others can discover new and exciting reads. Each branch will have special adult programs over the summer.
