County Road 22 Closed July 11 through August 12

(Road closure north of Sacramento Weir)

(**Woodland, CA**) – Due to road reconstruction, County Road 22 (Old River Road), north of the Sacramento Weir, will be closed to through traffic beginning at 6:00 a.m. on July 11 through August 1. Detour signs will direct motorists to alternate routes. Public access to the Elkhorn Boat Launching Facility and to the Elkhorn Station restaurant will be available from I-5.

Federal Highway Safety Improvement Program funds will reconstruct and widen 0.95 miles of County Road 22 from the Sacramento Weir north to County Road 128A. This portion of the roadway is a narrow levee road with no shoulders. The road will be widened to 32 feet where possible with no impact to the levee slopes. The remaining construction will be funded by Proposition 1B and will extend from County Road 128A northward 1.7 miles. This locally funded segment of the project will reconstruct the road with no additional widening.

The new road will have 11-foot wide travel lanes, a centerline rumble strip for safety and three to five-foot wide shoulders depending on the available levee width. The pavement grooves or rumble strip along the centerline will alert drivers if they drift out of the travel lane.

The existing road materials will be recycled in place by "Full Depth Recycling," an environmentally sensitive practice that recycles 100% of the road in place and produces a high quality road section at the lowest possible cost. This eliminates the removal and disposal of the existing road surface and the import of new replacement material.

Construction costs are approximately \$1,700,000. The low bid contractor is Argonaut Constructors, Inc. from Santa Rosa, California.
