Local leaders to be honored at CA House dinner

CA House will honor five Davis residents for their work to build tolerance at its annual Indian dinner and silent auction, beginning at 5:30 p.m. Saturday. The event takes place at the Davis Community Church Fellowship Hall, 421 D St.

Yolo County Supervisor Don Saylor, Andrew and Mary Jean Burke, the Rev. John Moore and Emily Pickens-Jones will be honored at the event, which benefits the student programs and activities of CA House's multifaith living community.

The evening will feature Indian food prepared by local resident Mary Philip, a silent auction and entertainment by students from the living community.
