Maricela wrote the following article about her own experience:





Alejandro recommends "spending as much time as you can working," for the goal. As Alejandro has been successful at devoting so much time to his studying, his tutor asked him to share how he manages family time in addition to studying. His strategy is to make sure he is "more careful with his family time." He is committed to making it quality time so that he can take the time to study. In addition to his personal motivation he finds much inspiration from Lynda's help, support, and time.
