- The runway should be moved rather than cut so many trees;
- Why should the trees be cut given this is a non-precision approach airport?:
- The Airport budget should be more fully explained;
- The Airport is an asset, and some people buy property in the area because the Airport is there;
- Better signage is needed to stop unauthorized incursions onto the runway by vehicles, horses, etc.;
- Regarding future development and the presentation at the February 2, 2012 meeting seeking comments about the Airport Master Plan:
 - Flooding is a key concern which must be solved if the airport is to be developed any further. This includes making sure birds are not attracted to ponds at the Airport;
 - Water drains ultimately to Putah Creek, so any drainage solution should consider impacts to the creek and all points in between;
 - o The West Plainfield Fire Station should not be moved;
 - The Airport should not be expanded because it will only generate more planes and noise;
 - Lack of infrastructure is an issue limiting further development, including electric power reliability, water use and drainage/detention;
 - CEQA will have to be followed for all future development;

Wes Ervin passed out the letter received from Caltrans documenting their recent airport inspection. Three issues were noted. They included trees on surrounding properties needing to be cut, crops growing too close to the runway, and the need for improved lighting and reflectors on the runway and taxiways.
