

Laura has been in the Yolo Reads program since 2011 and this year she spoke at the Yolo Reads Celebration. Below you can read her inspirational speech:

Good Evening Everyone. My name is Laura. I have participated in the Yolo Reads program for one year.



I want to share some of my experiences with the program.

I live in Davis with my family, my three children, and my husband. It is very important for me to be able to communicate with my children's teachers. It is also important to help my

children with their homework. That is why I decided to learn English.

Learning English has not been easy for me. Before participating in Yolo Reads, I had tried several programs. However, the classes were large, and the

teachers did not have time to help me when I became frustrated. In the end, I would drop out.

Yolo Reads has provided me with an opportunity to learn English in a setting where I can thrive. The one-on-one tutoring with my tutor, Darleen, is ideal for me. When I have a question, Darleen is there to help me answer it. When I get frustrated, Darleen is there to reassure me that I am learning. When I am not trying hard enough, Darleen is there to tell me to try harder. She has taught me the discipline it takes to learn a new language.

Every lesson gives me confidence that my English continues to improve. This confidence has opened doors for me. I am now comfortable communicating with teachers at school. I can also help my children with their homework.

Just as important is the fact that Yolo Reads helped me learn English well enough to become a U.S. citizen. This November I will be voting in my first presidential election. I will be able to read the voter information guide to vote on my own. This makes me very proud.

I want to thank Maria; my wonderful tutor, Darleen, and all the other program tutors for joining us in this special celebration. Please continue this great program to give others like me a chance.

She also thanked Yolo Reads for the opportunity it has given her. She spoke about her growing confidence and what a difference this has made. Laura's family also spoke. Both her children spoke of how proud they were of their mother and how Darleen had challenged

She mentioned how her learner had also just recently become a U.S. citizen. They are also looking forward to voting in November. Learner Sofia spoke about how her 'eyes were opened' and how learning a language was the gateway into a different culture-a culture she now feels a part of. The official portion of the evening ended at this time and everyone was able to break for refreshments and get to know

other members of Yolo Reads. Refreshments were supplied via the kind donations of gift certificates from The Nugget (Woodland) and The Nugget (West Sacramento), Raley's Corporation, Panaderia Mana (Woodland) and tutors and learners who brought dishes. The West Sacramento Friends of the Library and Grumpy Goats Farm provided monetary funds to provide appreciation gifts for learners and tutors.
