### **MINUTES**

Joint Meeting - Aviation Advisory/Airport Development Advisory Committees July 27, 2000

The Meeting was called to order outside Lillard Hall, Yolo County Airport, at 1. 7:35 p.m.

2. The meeting was opened for public comment on items not on the Agenda: There were no comments from the public.

There being no public comment, the meeting returned to the Agenda.

The Agenda was amended to ADD the Blue Max Cart Club to present its proposed project for a race tract facility at the Airport.

The proposal focused on approximately 10 to 12 acres adjacent to the Sportsman's leasehold at he the northeast quadrant of the Airport. The Club has been in existence for (28) years and needs to move. They would pay basic rent and a per person or per event use fees. As many as 20,000 visitors may be generated by their use of the race track.

Questions raised included: INSURANCE; REVENUE; AIRPORT MASTER PLAN; CONFLICTS WITH SPORTSMAN AND PRESTAR, NOISE/TRAFFIC; COMMERCIAL OR RECREATIONAL ACTIVITY; FUEL AND SAFETY; HOURS OF OPERATION.

Since it was felt by both groups that no notice was given through the Agenda process, such that interested constituents could appear, no action was taken. The matter was deferred to the next meeting, and with proper notice, a prerequisite.

- 3. A quorum of the Aviation Advisory Committee (AAC) was present, and at approximately 7:55 p.m., Peter Defty arrived, thus establishing a quorum for the Aviation Development Advisory Committee (ADAC).
- 4. Approval of the May 25, 2000 minutes was postponed.
- 5. A general discussion ensued about Airport Revenues.

The Airport revenues were discussed, especially the property tax issue. The rate is fixed at 1% on personal property (i.e., airplanes) and is shared 50/50 with the Davis Unified School District per state law. The total amount collected for 98-99 was approximately \$44,000. Current operations generate more, but that date was not available. The real property taxes, fixed by Proposition 13, generate only about \$3,000 for the Yolo County General Fund. The balance, approximately 30,000 is distributed according to the tax rate Area for other services (i.e., Libraries, Schools, Sheriff, etc.).

- 6. There was a general discussion about the condition of the Airport. M. Drack gave some estimates to slurry seal the runway. After much contribution by one and all, it was moved and seconded to recommend to the Board of Supervisors that the runway MUST be resealed as soon as possible, or the sub-base might be lost. The vote was unanimous, form both Committees.
- 7. Andrew Dowling resigned due to moving out of the area.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 p.m.
