(An Ordinance Amending Article 18 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the Yolo County Code Pertaining to the Waste Advisory Committee Duties and Responsibilities)

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo, State of California, ordains as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-2.1808(b) of Article 18 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the Yolo County Code is amended to read as follows:

(b) The duties and responsibilities of the Waste Advisory Committee shall be as follows:

(1) Advise the County staff, the Board of Supervisors of the County, and the staff, Mayors and Council Members of the Cities within the County on issues related to the development, approval, and administration of the County Hazardous Waste Management Plan.

(2) Hold informal public meetings and workshops as required on the County Hazardous Waste Management Plan.

(3) Review issues of integrated waste management relative to the County and provide recommendations to the County and Cities within the County on those issues.

(4) Conduct hearings for those appealing decisions made under Article 6, Chapter 15 of the Yolo County Code.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE/ PUBLICATION

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days after its passage, and prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days following its adoption, it shall be published once in The Daily Democrat, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Yolo.

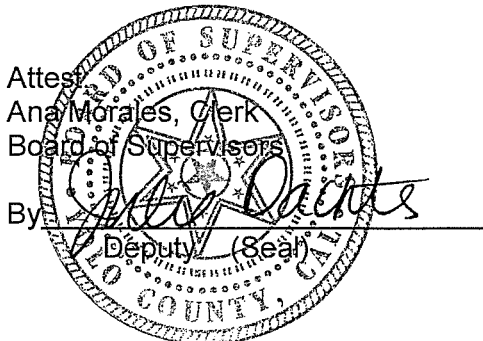

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF TITLE 2, ARTICLE 18,
WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, OF THE YOLO COUNTY CODE

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo, State of
California, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Article 18 of Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the
Yolo County Code is hereby amended in its entirety to read as
follows:

Article 18. WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE.

Sec. 2-2.1801. Created.

There is hereby created in the County a committee to be
known as the Yolo County Waste Advisory Committee as required
pursuant to Section 25135.2 of the Health and Safety Code.

The Waste Advisory Committee shall perform the duties of
the Local Task Force as required pursuant to Section 40950 of the
Public Resources Code.

Sec. 2-2.1803. Membership.

The membership of the Waste Advisory Committee shall
consist of eleven (11) rotating members who shall be selected as
follows:

a) One (1) member from each city shall be appointed by
the Cities of Davis, West Sacramento, Winters, and Woodland.

1 b) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint seven (7)
2 members as follows: one (1) representative of industry, one (1)
3 representative of an environmental organization, one (1)
4 representative of a special district such as a fire protection
5 district or a community services district, one (1) representative
6 from the University of California - Davis, and three (3)
7 representatives of the public who, to the extent possible, have
8 expertise concerning aspects of integrated waste management
9 planning, including, but not limited to, engineering, geology, and
10 water quality.

11 Sec. 2-2.1804. Membership Terms.

12 a) The term of membership shall be four (4) years.

13 b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the term of one (1)
14 City-appointed member shall expire each year, and the term of not
15 less than one (1), but not more than two (2) of the County-appointed
16 members shall expire each year. The Director of Public Works shall
17 develop a schedule to stagger the terms as set forth herein. The
18 Appointing Authority shall be advised of the expiration of a
19 member's term a minimum of two (2) months prior to the end of the
20 term.

21 c) Terms shall begin on February 1st and shall expire on
22 January 31st.

23 Sec. 2-2.1805. Membership Termination.

24 a) The Yolo County Waste Advisory Committee may
25 recommend termination of membership if in their opinion a member is
26 not adequately performing the duties for which the member was
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1 appointed. The Appointing Authority shall terminate the membership
2 of any person who in their opinion is not adequately performing the
3 duties for which the member was appointed.

4 b) Resignations of members shall be accompanied by a
5 letter or written documentation from the resigning member.

6 c) In the event of termination or resignation, the
7 Appointing Authority shall appoint a new member for the duration of
8 the unexpired term.

9 **Sec. 2-2.1806. Membership Organization.**

10 a) The Waste Advisory Committee shall meet and elect a
11 chairperson and vice-chairperson annually at its last meeting prior
12 to February 1st. Such officers shall serve until their successors
13 are elected. The Director of Public Works or a designee of the
14 Director shall serve as staff liaison to the Committee and shall
15 provide secretarial services to the Committee. The County Health
16 Officer or a designee of the County Health Officer shall also serve
17 as staff liaison. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint one (1)
18 Board member to serve as its liaison to the Committee.

19 **Sec. 2-2.1807. Meetings.**

20 a) Date. Meetings of the Waste Advisory Committee shall
21 be held on a regular date set by the Committee. The Chairperson may
22 call special meetings as necessary.

23 b) Quorum (Voting). A majority of all currently
24 appointed members shall constitute a quorum of the Waste Advisory
25 Committee. A majority of those present may take action on any
26 matter presented to the Committee.

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1 c) Minutes. The secretary of the Waste Advisory
2 Committee shall keep minutes of all specific actions taken and of
3 the recommendations made to the Board of Supervisors. The minutes
4 and member attendance shall be filed with the Clerk of the Board of
5 Supervisors, the Clerks of the City Councils, and with the City
6 Selection Committee.

7 Sec. 2-2.1808. Duties.

8 a) The duties and responsibilities of the Local Task
9 Force shall be as follows:

10 1) Identify solid waste management issues of
11 countywide or regional concern.

12 2) Determine the need for solid waste collection
13 and transfer systems, processing facilities and marketing
14 strategies, that can serve more than one local
15 jurisdiction within the region.

16 3) Facilitate the development of multi-
17 jurisdictional arrangements for the marketing of
18 recyclable materials.

19 4) To the extent possible, facilitate resolution of
20 conflicts and inconsistencies between or among city and
21 county source reduction and recycling elements.

22 5) Develop goals, policies and procedures which are
23 consistent with guidelines and regulations adopted by the
24 Board, to guide the development of the siting element of
25 the countywide integrated waste management plan.

1 b) The duties and responsibilities of the Waste Advisory
2 Committee shall be as follows:

3 1) Advise the County staff, the Board of
4 Supervisors of the County, and the staff, Mayors and
5 Council Members of the Cities within the County on issues
6 related to the development, approval, and administration
7 of the County Hazardous Waste Management Plan.

8 2) Hold informal public meetings and workshops as
9 required on the County Hazardous Waste Management Plan.

10 3) Review issues of integrated waste management
11 relative to the County and provide recommendations to the
12 County and Cities within the County on those issues.

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14 SECTION 2. Effective Date/Publication.

15 This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty
16 (30) days following its adoption, and prior to the expiration of
17 fifteen (15) days after passage, it shall be published once in THE
18 DAILY DEMOCRAT, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and
19 published in the County of Yolo.

ORDINANCE NO. 1106

(An Ordinance Amending the Yolo County Code
so as to Add Article 18 to Chapter 2 of Title 2
Creating the Yolo County Waste Advisory Committee)

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Yolo,
State of California, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 2 of Title 2 of the Yolo
County Code is hereby amended by the addition thereto of
Article 18 to read as follows:

Article 18. Waste Advisory Committee.

Sec. 2-2.1801. Created.

There is hereby created in the County a committee
to be known as the Yolo County Waste Advisory Committee.

Sec. 2-2.1802. Membership.

The membership of the Waste Advisory Committee shall
consist of eleven (11) rotating members who shall be selected
as follows:

a) Pursuant to Section 25135.2 of the Health
& Safety Code, four (4) members representing cities shall be
appointed by the City Selection Committee specified in Article
11, commencing with Section 50270, of Chapter 1 of Part 1 of
Division 1 of Title 5 of the Government Code, one (1) member
from each of the Cities of Davis, West Sacramento, Winters,
and Woodland.

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1 b) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint
2 seven (7) members including at least one (1) representative
3 of industry, one (1) representative of an environmental
4 organization, one (1) representative of a special district
5 such as a fire protection district or a community services
6 district, and four (4) representatives of the public who, to
7 the extent possible, have expertise and/or interest concerning
8 aspects of solid waste and hazardous waste management
9 planning, including, but not limited to, engineering, geology,
10 and water quality.

11 Sec. 2-2.1803. Membership Terms.

12 a) The term of membership shall be four (4)
13 years.

14 b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, of the
15 initial members serving terms of normal four-year duration,
16 one (1) appointed by the City Selection Committee and one (1)
17 appointed by the Board of Supervisors shall serve a term of
18 one (1) year, two (2) appointed by the City Selection
19 Committee and one (1) appointed by the Board of Supervisors
20 shall serve a term of two (2) years, and one (1) appointed by
21 the City Selection Committee and two (2) appointed by the
22 Board of Supervisors shall serve a term of three (3) years.
23 The allocation of terms shall be determined by the Waste
24 Advisory Committee by lot.

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1 c) Terms shall begin on February 1st and
2 shall expire on January 31st. The terms of the initial
3 members shall be computed from the February 1st following
4 appointment.

5 Sec. 2-2.1804. Membership: Termination.

6 a) The Board of Supervisors shall terminate
7 the membership of any person who has three (3) consecutive
8 unexcused absences from scheduled meetings or who, if
9 appointed by the Board and in the opinion of the Board of
10 Supervisors, is not adequately performing the duties for which
11 the member was appointed.

12 b) Resignations of members shall be
13 accompanied by a letter or written documentation from the
14 member or the Waste Advisory Committee.

15 Sec. 2-2.1805. Membership: Organization.

16 a) The Waste Advisory Committee shall meet
17 and elect a chairperson and vice-chairperson annually at its
18 last meeting prior to February 1st. Such officers shall serve
19 until their successors are elected. The Director of Public
20 Works or his or her designee shall serve as staff liaison to
21 the Committee and shall provide secretarial services to the
22 Committee. The County Health Officer or his or her designee
23 shall also serve as staff liaison. The Board of Supervisors
24 shall appoint one Board member to serve as its liaison to the
25 Committee.

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1 Sec. 2-2.1806. Meetings.

2 a) Date. Meetings of the Waste Advisory
3 Committee shall be held from time to time as is appropriate
4 on a regular date set by the Committee. The Chairperson may
5 call such special meetings as may be necessary.

6 b) Quorum. A majority of all serving members
7 shall constitute a quorum of the Waste Advisory Committee

8 c) Minutes. The secretary of the Waste
9 Advisory Committee shall keep minutes of all specific actions
10 taken and of the recommendations made to the Board of
11 Supervisors and of the members present and absent and shall
12 file copies with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.

13 Sec. 2-2.1807. Duties.

14 The duties and responsibilities of the Waste
15 Advisory Committee shall be as follows:

16 a) To advise the Board of Supervisors on
17 solid and hazardous waste matters affecting the County and the
18 citizens and industries of all areas of the County and to make
19 recommendations to the Board of Supervisors on waste
20 management issues, including, but not limited to:

21 1) The County Integrated Waste
22 Management Plan, required by the California Integrated Waste
23 Management Act of 1989 (Public Resources Code §§40000 and
24 following), which must be updated and resubmitted to the
25 Integrated Waste Management Board of California as required;

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1 and,

2 2) Solid waste management practices in
3 Yolo County.

4 b) To advise the County staff, the Board of
5 Supervisors of the County, and the staff, mayors and council
6 members of the cities within the county on issues related to
7 the development, approval, and administration of the County
8 Hazardous Waste Management Plan.

9 c) To hold public meetings and workshops as
10 required on the County Hazardous Waste Management Plan

11 Sec. 2-2.1808. Local Task Force.

12 a) Pursuant to §40950 of the Public Resources
13 Code, the Waste Advisory Committee shall perform the duties
14 of the Local Task Force as required.

15 Sec. 2-2.1809. Local Assessment Committee.

16 a) Members of the Waste Advisory Committee
17 may be designated by the Board of Supervisors to serve as a
18 Local Assessment Committee pursuant to Health and Safety Code
19 §25199.7 (AB 2948 Tanner, 1986). The Board of
20 Supervisors reserves the authority to appoint additional Local
21 Assessment Committees as may be appropriate.

22 SECTION 2. Ordinance Number 1044 of the County
23 of Yolo is hereby repealed.

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SECTION 3. Effective Date/Publication.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force thirty (30) days following its adoption, and prior to the expiration of fifteen (15) days after passage, it shall be published once in THE DAILY DEMOCRAT, a newspaper of general circulation, printed and published in the County of Yolo.
