- Year founded: 1867
- History in Yolo:
 - FamiliesFirst began in Davis in 1974 as the Praul Center;
 - The Yolo Crisis Nursery was founded in 2001;
 - Wraparound and Community Based Services started in 2008;
 - EMQ and FamiliesFirst merged in 2009.
