What is *Katie A?*

Katie A v. Bonta is a class action lawsuit filed in 2002 concerning the availability of intensive mental health services to children in California who are either in foster care or at high risk of coming into foster care.

A settlement agreement was reached in the case in December 2011.

Katie A. Sub-Class Members

Children/youth (up to age 21) are considered to be a member of the Subclass if they meet the following criteria:

- Are full-scope Medi-Cal (Title XIX) eligible;
- Have an open child welfare services case; and
- Meet the medical necessity criteria for Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS) as set forth in CCR, Title 9, Section 1830.205 or Section 1830.210.

In addition to:

- Currently in or being considered for: wraparound, therapeutic foster care, specialized care rate due to behavioral health needs or other intensive EPSDT services, including but not limited to therapeutic behavioral services or crisis stabilization/intervention; or
- Currently in or being considered for group home (RCL 10 or above), a psychiatric hospital or 24-hour mental health treatment facility (e.g., psychiatric inpatient hospital, community residential treatment facility); or has experienced
