Workers' Compensation Fraud Suspect Sentenced

Woodland, CA — March 10, 2008 — On March 5th, 2008, BRYAN K ROSE, age 42, of West Sacramento, CA was sentenced on five counts of workers' compensation fraud. Judge Timothy Fall of the Yolo County Superior Court, sentenced ROSE to five years of formal felony probation, ordered to pay \$20,000 in restitution, and spend three hundred days in the county jail. The jail order was suspended pending successful completion of probation, which includes the payment of restitution to Liberty Mutual Insurance Company.

ROSE was found guilty by a jury, when he was discovered coaching football, playing competitive wiffle ball, and lifting heavy objects. All in sharp contrast to what he told his doctor were his physical limitations. These activities were caught on film by private investigators hired by the victim and then submitted with a complaint to the District Attorney's office for investigation.

Jeff Reisig, District Attorney, says "cases like this one, result when claimants embellish their injuries to receive more benefit than they are entitled." Lt. Dan Stroski who is in charge of the Insurance Fraud Unit for the Yolo County District's Office says, "By simply telling the truth while on workers' compensation, you can avoid troubles with the law."

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
