Caren Livingstone/Consumer and LMHB: The Wellness Center Art Show is coming up on May 2<sup>nd</sup>-3<sup>rd</sup>, 2013 in the Walker/ Thompson Conference Room

#### Kim/ADMH:

- ➤ DESS and ADMH are working on the readiness plan for implementing Katie A. the plan is due by 05/15/13. Regional training was held yesterday. A stakeholder forum will be held by DESS and ADMH and updates will be sent soon.
- Patrick Blacklock: The solar panels on the west side of the Bauer Building have gone up and are linked into the PG&E power grid. This is site, in conjunction with the south Davis project site will produce 100% of County power. This program was set up with no out of pocket expense by taking advantage of federal subsidies, bill crediting programs and other complex balancing programs.
- Joan Beesley/MHSA for ADMH: Regarding Mental Health First Aid curriculum: the youth curriculum will be available in 2 weeks and will be 8 hours. Modifications to the adult curriculum include being shortened to 8 hours along with new manuals. Contact: <u>Joan</u> or <u>Justin Hall</u>.
- Karen Larsen/CommuniCare:
  - > SAMHSA grant/offender reentry grant was submitted last week. Updates will be available in August.
  - The CommuniCare new site is visibly progressing.
- Patrick/CAO: HHS Update regarding the integration possibility of ADMH, PH, and DESS, the County has
  decided to fund the process to consider this based on best practices and statewide examples. An RFQ is in
  process and stakeholder outreach and this group are important considerations. Analysis of the options will
  be fast moving through June and July.
- Nate Palmer/Yolo County Probation Department: Referrals to Fourth and Hope have resumed, after approval from the auditor's office, and they are back to full capacity contract placement. Working to extend a few substance abuse and mental health contracts with transitional living.
- Diana White/Turning Point: Rehabilitation of the Williams building in Davis is occurring. The building looks
  great and functions well. They are closing Pinetree Gardens apartments and transitioning people. Pinetree
  Gardens is closing due to structural, foundation and safety concerns in this ageing building. Also, current
  occupancy is low so it has been a money drain. Turning Point would like to hear of any concerns.
- Michelle Kellogg/YCCC: Safe Harbor Crisis House needs to be painted and they encourage all to vote to win the Brooks Painting contest. Check it out on the YCCC <u>Facebook Page</u>.
- Tico Zendejas/R.I.S.E: Mentioned PEI training and new strategies.
- Maggi Shubert/DRC: has the 3<sup>rd</sup> intake next week with 12 scheduled. They are in the process of working
  with Fourth and Hope and Cache Creek Lodge for housing and are in the early stages with other provider
  regarding services to be provided.
- Luky Maldonado/Safety Center: The DUI system is looking at the possibility of bringing MADD in as an additional court requirement.

## **Budget Updates**

- County/State Budget: Patrick Blacklock
  - There is little to report. The Affordable Health Care Act, State efforts to pull back realignment funds, and federal sequestration at 5% continue to be challenging issues.
  - > The County budget remains flat and we hope that it will stay this way until June.
- Departments and Providers: All
  - > ADMH: Contract meetings are starting and some have already been scheduled. Some will proceed with group meetings and other will be individual, depending on services and the players involved.
  - Probation: The budget is looking balanced.

- Laura's Law Update: Kim
  - On Monday 04/22/13, two presentations were given by Nevada County, one to a meeting and the other a community meeting of the LMHB. Michael Heggarty, Director, Nevada County Behavioral Health, Honorable Judge Thomas M. Anderson, Nevada County Superior Court, and Carol Stanchfield, Program Director did and excellent job of explaining the Nevada County experience.
  - Summary of the Nevada County process shared.
  - Feedback from this (PSWG) group is requested. ADMH needs to make a recommendation to BOS along with the LMHB which is discussing Laura's Law at the May meeting. A meeting with consumers will be held next month in Wellness Center to get feedback.
- CCP/AB 109 Update: Nate Palmer
  - The 05/13/13 meeting may be postponed until the 20<sup>th</sup> to accommodate a presentation. The CCP is starting to develop budget. There will be additional funds under AB109 to consider in the range of \$600-\$900k. Proposals above and beyond existing programming will be solicited next week by Marlon please identify program areas and needs to discuss.
  - ➤ Response from question: Regarding the Offender Needs Guide (ONG) data and it's appropriateness for use as an accurate reflection of needs, the responsible analyst has been on an extended vacation so during the 2<sup>nd</sup> RFP process, they will assess the need as referrals are being made and the ONG status will be included.
