About CommuniCare

CommuniCare Health Centers is a Federally Qualified Health Center providing health care to those in need since 1972. CommuniCare offers comprehensive primary medical and dental services, substance abuse treatment, behavioral health services, health education and support services in Yolo County and the surrounding communities through five community clinic sites and outreach programs.

CommuniCare Health Centers' mission is to provide high quality health care to those in need.

In 2012, CommuniCare served 21,687 individuals, provided 94,791 visits, 35,282 health education encounters, and 550 births.

Behavioral Health Services

Adult Services' offers outpatient services for adults struggling with substance use disorders and specialized services for individuals experiencing a range of mild to moderate mental health issues. Services are provided within the Stages of Change framework utilizing the Recovery Model. Approaches to care are evidence-based and include **Moral Reconciliation Therapy (MRT)**, Courage to Change Interactive Journaling, Motivational interviewing and other valuable tools within group and individual treatment modalities. Services are offered in Woodland and West Sacramento and include a variety of ancillary services, depending on need such as family and fatherhood groups, detoxification, and referrals to other community resources.

The services are divided into two programs:

The Outpatient Substance Abuse Recovery Program (OSARP) serves men and women who need assistance in beginning a clean and sober lifestyle. This four-phase program utilizes individual and group treatment modalities to provide participants a structured environment that promotes recovery, and provides relapse prevention and other addiction related information. Attention is focused on preparing for treatment participation, enhancing motivation to change and supporting people in initiation of action.

Dual Diagnosis is an integrated program serving adults with a range of mild to moderate mental health and substance abuse issues. This four-phase six month program utilizes both individual and group treatment modalities with an emphasis on stabilization of mental health and substance abuse symptoms. The program integrates a variety of educational, motivational, and cognitive behavioral strategies promoting client involvement in the process of recovery and wellness.

The Perinatal Day Treatment (PNDT) program is an intensive day program (3 hours a day, 4 days per week) developed to meet the gender-specific needs of pregnant and parenting women with young children. The program includes individual and group therapy with a strong emphasis on parenting, relationships, drug education, and health and well-being. The PNDT program works to support and assist women with family reunification requirements, as mandated by Child Protective Services and/or other referring agencies. An on-site Child Development Program offers childcare to children ages 0-5. A variety of evidence based and cognitive behavioral curriculum are offered including: *Nurturing Parenting, Seeking Safety and Courage to Change*. This program is a minimum of six months in length and transportation is provided to and from treatment for women and their children.

Integrated Behavioral Health Services are delivered within each of the primary care clinics and are available for all CommuniCare patients. The Behavioral Health staff is part of the patient's health care team, working in collaboration with Primary Providers to support comprehensive mind and body wellness. Our licensed/licensed-eligible clinicians imbue person-centered strength based approaches to healing, recognizing that personal sovereignty is the catalyst for change and a vehicle for recovery.

Services provided include: short term solution focused counseling (6-10 sessions); wellness self-management groups (open to all CCHC members); medication stabilization services with staff psychiatrist; Social Security disability claims assistance; coordination of referrals to substance abuse recovery programs; assistance in managing serious health conditions such as chronic pain; access to no cost medications; HIV case management; and intensive medical case management services for patients with more complex medical needs.
