ANTHRAX DRILL POST EXPOSURE PROPHYLLAXIS DRUGS

CIPROFLAXIN 500 MG. TABLETS (Cipro)

You have been given this drug to prevent potential Anthrax infection after a biohazard alarm in your facility. <u>Begin taking this medicine immediately</u> and continue until instructed to stop. You will be informed if you need an additional supply of the drug if Anthrax is positively confirmed in the facility.

Cipro belongs to a class of drugs called quinolone antibiotics. It is approved by the Centers for Disease Control to protect people who have been exposed to anthrax spores.

How to take Cipro

Dosage: Take 1 tablet every 12 hours

- Take Cipro 2 hours before or after a meal with at least one glass of water. If an upset stomach occurs, Cipro may be taken with food.
- Avoid dairy products (milk or yogurt) for at least 3 hours before and after taking Cipro.
- Avoid vitamins or antacids (Tums or Maalox) for at least 6 hours before or 2 hours after taking Cipro.
- <u>If you miss a dose</u>, start taking 1 pill every 12 hours. Do not take 2 pills to make up for the missed dose.
- <u>Finish your pills, even if you feel okay</u>, unless your doctor tells you to stop. If you stop this medicine too soon you may become ill.

Side Effects

- Common side effects of this drug include upset stomach, vomiting, diarrhea, fatigue, dizziness, or headache.
- Less common side effects include pain in the arms or legs, changes in vision, restlessness, ringing in the ears or mental changes.
- If any of these symptoms occur, call your doctor immediately.

Allergic Reactions are rare.

- Signs of an allergic reaction are rash, itching, swelling of the tongue, hands, or feet, fever, or trouble breathing.
- If any of these occur, call your doctor immediately.

Precautions

- If this drug makes you dizzy, use caution driving or doing tasks that require you to be alert. Avoid alcohol, which will make dizziness worse.
- Cipro can make skin sensitive to the sun, which increases the chance of severe sunburn. Avoid the sun and wear long sleeves and a hat when outside. Always use sunscreen (30 SPF).
