## CHILD MOLEST CONVICTION

Woodland-March 13th – Marco Vincincio Carranza, 48, was convicted of two counts of child molest charges in a case tried before Yolo County Superior Court Judge David Rosenberg. Judge Rosenberg found Carranza guilty of "continuous sexual abuse of a child" and "oral copulation" on a child.

Carranza orally copulated the victim, a 12 year old girl, in the computer room in the house where she lived with her mother. When this came to light, the victim disclosed that Carranza had violated her by making her engage in numerous other sexual acts during the preceding two years.

Prosecuting attorney James Walker stated, "Nobody should take the innocence away from a young child. Although we can never get that innocence back for this young girl, justice was served and Carranza will be removed from our society for many, many years."

According to District Attorney Jeff Reisig, "Carranza faces a sentence of up to 18 years in prison for his crimes. Although closure is impossible here, justice was served by the judge's verdicts."

Carranza will be sentenced by Judge Rosenberg at a future court date.
