 - a. California Legislation – synopsis of legislation passed in 2011 which drives the realignment effort throughout California
 - b. Yolo County Plans – a description of how Yolo County completed the initial mitigation plan and subsequent plans to date
- II. Yolo County Tactical Plan
 - a. Goal 5: Preserve and ensure safe and crime free communities
 - i. In order to demonstrate that the CCP is in alignment with what the County has developed in the overall County Tactical Plan, a description of this plan and goal would assist stakeholders and the public in seeing a seamless connection.
- III. Community Corrections Partnership In Yolo County
 - a. Members – a brief listing of executive members along with other invited participants of these meetings. Perhaps a description of who staffs the meetings would also provide clarity for the public.
 - b. Meetings – a description of when and where the CCP meetings occur and how they comply with the Brown Act.
- IV. Strategic Plan
 - a. Mission – once developed or revised, this will provide a statement of purpose and what the work is of the CCP.
 - b. Strategic Goals – once revised, these become the target of how the mission is carried out and should identify how they will be measured. These will also become a regular focus of the CCP meetings.
 - c. Operational Plan (see attached format) – this will be how the goals are operationalized within the system. If work groups are developed or renewed to complete the work, the objectives and tasks identified in the operational plan will be the focus. These will also clearly indicate who is responsible, the timeline of completion, and the progress or status. Reports of this work should be made to the CCP on a regular basis.
