YCCC History

- ❖ Started with funding from the Bates Bill
- ❖ Farmhouse was the first program
- ❖ Safe Harbor
- ❖ New Dimensions Supported Housing
- ❖ GAP

The Farmhouse

- ❖ Rural Davis
- ❖ Transition to independent living
- ❖ Long term residential program
 - Independent living skills
 - Pre vocational program
 - Transition to supportive housing
- ❖ Outcome: Moves individuals from long term locked hospitalization to supportive housing
- ❖ Farm to Mouth Program



New Dimensions Supportive Housing

- ❖ Co-op Houses: 9 bedrooms
 - Davis, Woodland
 - Affordable to those on SSI
- ❖ SHP co-op housing: 9 bedrooms
 - Woodland
 - For those who do not have SSI
- ❖ New Dimensions Apartments: 15 units
 - Woodland
 - Residents pay 1/3 of their income
- ❖ Homestead Co-op Apartments: 21 units
 - Davis
 - Affordable for those on SSI
- ❖ Outcome: 90% do not use hospital services



YCCC Main/GAP Office

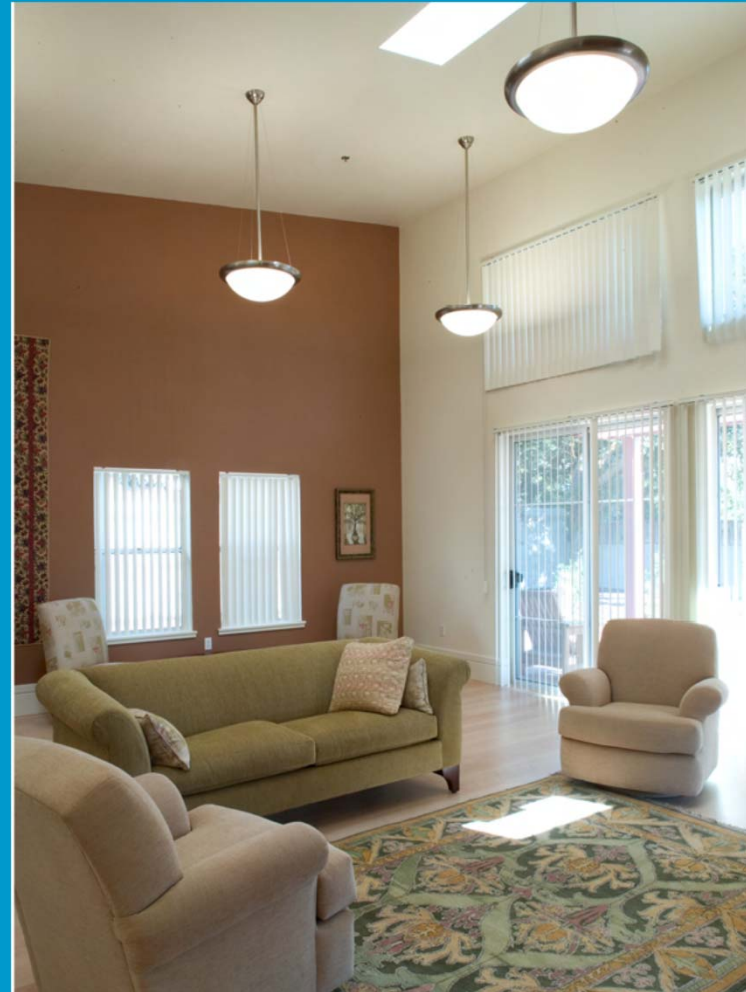
- ❖ Originally a day rehabilitation and wellness center
- ❖ Greater Access Program (GAP)
 - Serves unserved/underserved with a serious mental illness
 - Assists with benefits acquisition, accessing medicines, psychiatric evaluation, case management, crisis residential mental health services, residential substance abuse treatment, and connection to community supports



Safe Harbor Crisis House

- ❖ Semi-rural Woodland
- ❖ Short term residential program
 - Crisis intervention for acute episodes
 - Step between hospital & home
 - Define & limit crisis
 - Plan immediate future
 - Mobilize appropriate resources
 - Group & individual counseling
- ❖ Outcome: Reduces hospitalization during crisis

Budget & Staffing

- ❖ \$2.23 Million budget per year
- ❖ County contracts, Insurance contracts, Federal funding, Grants and Private donations
- ❖ 54 full time and part time employees
- ❖ Bachelor's level, Master's level, and Master's level interns make up the staff
- ❖ Volunteers used for specific program projects
- ❖ Nursing students provide health support

Who we serve

- ❖ Over 500 unduplicated clients served in all the programs
- ❖ Ethnic breakdown
 - 60% Caucasian
 - 20% Hispanic
 - 10% African American
 - 5% Asian/Pacific Islander
 - 5% Other ethnicities

- ❖ Mild to moderate
- ❖ SMI/SED

Funding Streams

- ❖ Medi-Cal referrals come thru ADMH
- ❖ Safe Harbor is on the insurance panels of Kaiser Permanente, Magellan, and Insight
- ❖ Single case agreements
- ❖ Private Pay
- ❖ New Dignity Health grant allows referrals from Suicide Prevention to Safe Harbor

Referral Pathways

- ❖ Call the program directly
- ❖ Call insurance provider to get authorization for residential treatment
- ❖ Call GAP to get a referral to that program
- ❖ Call ADMH for any Medi-Cal client
