Authorize submittal of 2014-2019 Airport Capital Improvement Program and 2014 grant application for \$106,500 to the Federal Aviation Administration for an Airport Layout Plan update and perimeter fencing design; authorize the County Administrator to execute the grant agreement and implement the grant if awarded; and authorize the County Administrator to apply to Caltrans for matching funds, accept grant funds, execute the grant and sign all documents as needed. (No general fund impact) (Nunes/Ervin)

Recommended Action

- A. Authorize submittal of 2014-2019 Airport Capital Improvement Program;
- B. Authorize submittal of 2014 grant application for \$106,500 to the Federal Aviation Administration for Airport Layout Plan revisions and perimeter fencing design;
- C. Authorize the County Administrator to execute the grant agreement and implement the grant if awarded; and
- D. Authorize the County Administrator to apply to Caltrans Aeronautics Division for matching funds, accept grant funds, execute the grant and sign all documents as needed.

Reason for Recommended Action/Background

The annual Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grant approval process requires all grant requests to be compliant with the County's Airport Capital Improvement Program (ACIP). The projects in this 2014-2019 ACIP are consistent with the adopted Airport Master Plan and Environmental Impact Review (EIR), the Yolo County General Plan, and other approved Airport planning documents.

The 2014-2019 ACIP submittal uses limited available FAA funding as effectively as possible and advances the County's priority of top quality and sustainable Airport facilities and infrastructure. The FAA entitles the county to apply for \$150,000 per year plus any unused funding from prior years. For 2014, the County can apply for up to \$300,000. In addition, FAA has discretionary funds for major

projects, but most FAA discretionary funds are programmed for runway safety projects at large airports and will not be available until 2015 or later.

This ACIP will advance two important Airport projects in 2014:

- 1. Preparing Airport Layout Plan drawings preparatory to the design of drainage ponds and other structures necessary to accommodate future development.
- 2. Designing airport perimeter fencing as our most important security improvement, preparatory to construction in 2015.

Airport Layout Plan

As of October 2013 FAA is requiring an Airport Layout Plan (ALP) update as a prerequisite to seeking FAA funds for on-airport drainage improvements. Specifically, the ALP must show the location of proposed detention ponds and other drainage structures. Developing an updated ALP typically takes 9 months to a year which means most of our other planned capital projects will be delayed by one year.

Perimeter Fencing

In the last year our airport tenants have become increasingly concerned about unauthorized vehicles and pedestrians in hangar, taxiway and runway areas. Such incursions are causing a nuisance to our tenants. Our most active tenants have requested gates and have an informal "neighborhood watch" program to approach trespassing vehicles and film them. The Sheriff has been called on two occasions. Perimeter fencing is also recommended by the FAA at general aviation airports as a critical security measure against theft, vandalism, and unauthorized incursions on the runways and taxiways. Other airports in the region that are urban and/or provide similar services (Fuel, repair, concierge, etc.) are fully fenced. While fencing has been an expected future project on our ALP for many years, we have not included perimeter fencing on our previous ACIP project lists until now. While we wait for drainage design we can proceed now with perimeter fencing, which will not create new impervious surface.

FAA's Evaluation and grant process

FAA uses a nationwide point system as part of its process for determining how they allow their funds to be used. Priority funding goes to runway and safety improvements, taxiway improvements, and apron improvements in that order. FAA funds drainage improvements when needed to ensure that the priority areas and future development areas of an airport do not flood. In order to move forward with other airport development, we need to know exactly what drainage facilities must be built to ensure that development does not increase its contribution to flooding downstream, particularly in the nearby Rolling Acres subdivision.

FAA has a lengthy annual grant review and approval process that involves several deadlines throughout the year. As the year proceeds, final funding may differ somewhat from the initial application. This Board letter requests Board approval of the entire grant process:

Input on the ACIP was obtained from the Aviation Advisory Committee and from the West Plainfield Advisory Committee on Airport Development (WPAC). The Aviation Advisory Committee did not take action to support the plan due to a lack of quorum although members present expressed support. The WPAC took action to support the plan with the following reccommendations:

- 1. In 2014, remove the words "detention ponds" to allow the possibility of other drainage structures being more desirable and effective.
- 2. In 2014, design only the gates portion of the fencing plan and hold the perimeter fencing until an analysis can be completed of the need for complete fencing.
- 3. In 2019, remove the runway rehabilitation.

Staff accepts recommendations 1 and 2 as feasible and with Board support and direction can modify the verbiage. Staff does not recommend removing the runway rehabilitation as regular maintenance of the runway is important to avoid the long-term impact of neglect. By 2019, the runway will be ten years old and it is prudent to provide rehabilitation at that point in order to retain the existing pavement lifespan.

Staff solicited comments from the Aviation Advisory Committee and the West Plainfield Advisory Committee on Airport Development at a joint January 22, 2014 meeting.


