Isolation Order

Isolation order for: _____ (Name)

Rationale for order: Based upon a review and evaluation of your health status and risk of exposure, you have or are likely to have a contagious disease called Avian Flu. You have not complied or have indicated that you will not comply with recommendations from the Public Health Department that you remain isolated.

Order: It is hereby ordered that you stay at home and have no visitors until the Health Officer or designee states that you are no longer contagious and a minimum of 10 days have passed after fever and cough are gone. In addition, you must wear a mask at all times when in the presence of others in the home. If you cannot wear the mask due to your medical condition, it is essential that others in the same room wear masks. You must cover you mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing, sneezing, or laughing. The places that you must not go include, but are not limited to, work or place of employment, school, church, a mall or grocery store or to a theater. If you need emergency medical care, you must immediately inform the health care personnel of your contagious Avian Flu condition. Any non-urgent medical treatment must be delayed until you are no longer contagious. You will be subject to a medical evaluation by a public health official or designee to verify your health status.

Legal Authority: California Health and Safety Code, Sections 120175 and 120195 give the local health officer or her/his delegate the authority to issue orders deemed necessary to protect the public health and safety, or the health of any other person and to enforce the California law, which includes statutes, as well as rules, regulations, and orders of the California Department of Health Services. Section 120130 also provides the authority for the adoption and enforcement of isolation and quarantine orders. The California Code of Regulations, Title 17, Sections 2501,2516,2518, and 2522 requires the local health officer to take whatever steps deemed necessary for the investigation and control of reported communicable diseases. This includes isolating any person who has a reportable disease and observing such persons to determine whether he/she is free of the disease for which he/she has been placed under isolation. California Health and Safety Code, Section 120275 states that any person violating an order of quarantine or isolation issued by the health officer is guilty of a misdemeanor. Under California Health and Safety Code, Section 120295, violation of this order can result in a fine and/or imprisonment in jail, for each day that the violation continues.
