- Call to Order and Introductions The February 9, 2015, meeting of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) was called to order at 1:36 pm.

- 3. Approval of Minutes from January 12, 2015 Motion: Tracie Olson, Second Ed Prieto Vote: Passes 7.0
- Justice Reinvestment Initiative Update
 - a. Jail Treatment Coordinator Sheriff

Nate Palmer gave update regarding the Justice Reinvestment Initiative (JRI). Sheriff Prieto hired Ms. Emily Kochly, the new Jail Treatment Coordinator at the Monroe Detention Center. Sheriff Prieto states Ms. Kochly is a great addition to his team and will be a great asset to the department and the community.

b. Ohio Risk Assessment Tools – Probation

Chief Cardall states the probation department has "gone live" with our new Case Management System. We are now using the Ohio Risk Assessment tool as of Monday, February 2nd.

c. Soaring II and Risk-Needs-Responsivity (RNR) Provider Programming Assessments – Probation

Nate Palmer gave an overview of the Soaring II Programming Assessment Tool. Probation will establish four coaches to train officers in updated EBP case management practices. All of the providers currently contracted to provide services funded by the CCP including the Sacramento County Office of Education, CommuniCare Health Services, Cache Creek Lodge, and Fourth and Hope will undergo the Risk Needs Responsivity Assessment Tool coordinated by George Mason University and Probation Staff.

d. Felony Court Reminder System – Courts/Probation

Shawn Landry gave a short update on the new court call-in system. Things are going very well with the project and Mr. Landry is looking forward to the system being implemented in approximately one – two months.

5. Presentation by Municipal Police Departments – Chief Black/Deanne Machado

Chief Black introduced Ms. Deanne Machado of the Davis Police Department. Ms. Machado gave us a detailed overview of the Yolo County Crime Report regarding violent crimes, burglaries, larcenies, adult and juvenile arrest data for 2011 – 2014. Also, included in her presentation were Parole, Probation and PRCS contacts and arrests for 2012 – 2014. The data encompasses, Davis, West Sacramento, Woodland and Winters. DA Reisig requested a more extensive data report outlining violent crimes from PDs. Ms. Machado will collect this data and present to the CCP in the near future. Discussion.

 DA Reisig will continue to pursue restitution collection through the canteen fund to increase victim restitution revenue. Discussion will continue with the Sheriff's Department. Sheriff Prieto gave a detailed summary of the canteen fund and the low return of revenue that could be expected from pursuing this option.
 - iii. Probation/Sheriff (3f)Chief Cardall reports the Day Reporting Center is continuing at 80%.
 - iv. Public Defender (2a1)
 PD Olson gave update.
 - Ms. Olson suggested separating goals 2a1 because the objectives between the Public Defender and Davis Police Department are separate tasks and require individual solutions independent of each leads work.
