Yolo County, CA Code of Ordinances Sec. 7-1.04 (Section 105.5 Expiration). Every permit issued by the building official under the provisions of this code shall expire by limitation and become null and void if the building, structure, equipment or work authorized by such permit is not commenced within 180 days from the date of such permit, or if the building, structure, equipment or work authorized by such permit is suspended or abandoned at any time after the work is commenced for a period of 180 days. Before such work can be recommenced, a new permit shall be first obtained to do so, and the fee therefore shall be one-half the amount required for a new permit for such work as set forth in the current fee schedule as adopted by the Board of Supervisors, provided no changes have been made or will be made to the original plans or specifications for such work, and provided further that such suspension or abandonment has not exceeded one year.
