**8:30 A.M. CALL TO ORDER**

1. **WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS – Stephen Nowicki, Chair**  
The May 18, 2016 MCAH Advisory Board meeting was called to order at 8:35 a.m., at which time around the table introductions occurred and quorum was confirmed.

5. **MCAH DIRECTOR’S REPORT – Jan Babb**

  - Jan Babb welcomed Dr. Ron Chapman, the Health Officer, to his first MCAH Advisory Board meeting. Dr. Chapman has been with Yolo County HHS for just over six months now.
  - Laurie Somerhausen shared that WIC is seeking to increase caseload and is happy to receive any referrals.
  - Lizeth Betancourt shared that some information on the breastfeeding services available, typically to WIC clients. Due to some expansion, breastfeeding services and support will now be available to women working in agriculture. Lizeth will be providing education to the employers, as well as battery-powered pumps, cools, portable screens and other supplies to breastfeeding women. In addition, Lizeth can provide support to breastfeeding women and employers in regards to workplace accommodations.
  - Lizeth is working to build up the Breastfeeding Coalition. If you are interested in participating, please let her know.
  - Ramy Husseini shared that that Youth Risk Behavior Survey results will be released for the high schools in California in June, with the data for middle schools and minorities being available in July. This is the first year that there will be enough data for California, due to the CDC partnering with the Department of Education. Data will not be available at the County or city level, only Statewide.
  - Ramy also shared that there are two bills that are being voted up on Monday. The first bill, SB999 Consistent Access to Birth Control, will allow plans to give up to a year’s supply of birth control. The second bill, AB1954 Direct Access to Reproductive Health Act, will allow women to see their OBGYN without a referral from the primary care provider.

**6. CHILD, YOUTH AND FAMILY BRANCH REPORT – Alissa Sykes**

- Child Welfare Services is finalizing a training program for staff, which will include a focus on community resources. You may be contacted to help support that effort. The State has specific training requirements for Child Welfare social workers. Yolo County HHSA now has resources, such as a training supervisor to handle some of that training internally. This training supervisor will provide some training herself but also coordinate other trainings as needed.
- Within the branch, the majority of mental health services for children and transitional aged youth are contracted out. A small unit is employed by the agency that primarily serves transitional aged youth. This in-house unit will be handing off the transitional aged youth to either the Adult and Aging branch or to contracting providers in order to shift the focus to children in foster care. This is to ensure support for the children in foster care, as well as their caregivers and to promote better outcomes. Due to several factors, including an increased awareness of children’s mental health needs, caregivers asking more specific questions about behaviors, an increase in assessments and referrals, and a waitlist of 70 children, this expansion of the services will have a home-based approach. A formal screening process for all children entering the foster care system has been established and now there will be staff embedded in the Child Welfare units who can do assessments and better triage for services.
- Jaime Ordonez shared that the CHDP program will be holding vision training this Friday for 16-17 providers.
- Jaime Ordonez shared an update on the CCS redesign. On May 5<sup>th</sup>, the trailer bill outlining the CCS redesign was rejected. Senator Hernandez introduced a new bill, SB586, which would extend CCS redesign to 2025. This new bill would still transfer care coordination to the managed care providers, but there would now be an application, County approval system, and an evaluation. This bill would take affect no earlier than July 2017.
