

Goals of the Color-Coded (GYR) System


- Improve food safety awareness
- Reduce foodborne illness
- Increase consumer confidence with a highly visible system
- Increase compliance with food safety laws

Color-Coded Disclosure System

- Patterned after Toronto
- Easy to Understand: Pass/Fail
- Simple Formula based on major food safety violations
- Allows for Re-Inspections



Based on Five CDC Major Risk Factors

- Improper Holding Temperatures
- Inadequate Cooking
- Poor Personal Hygiene
- Contaminated Equipment
- Food from Unsafe Sources







Yellow (CONDITIONAL PASS) Placard Criteria

- Two or more major violations (corrected at the inspection), or
- The same major violation noted in three or more consecutive inspections, or
- Violation of a Compliance Agreement




Red (CLOSED) Placard Criteria

 Any major violation that poses an imminent health hazard and cannot be corrected during the inspection

Re-Inspection Standards

 Re-inspections for Yellow Placards will be conducted within three department business days, but typically within one or two days.



 Re-inspections for Red Placards will be conducted once the violation has been corrected and within 3 business days after a request for a re-inspection.



Re-Inspection Charges

 No charge will be assessed for the first re-inspection but subsequent re-inspections will be charged per each routine inspection.

Posting Requirements



- Within five feet of the entry door
- In a display case on the outside within five feet of the entry door
- For shared facilities, at the initial patron contact area
- Other location approved by the Health Officer


