9:00 A.M. CALL TO ORDER

1. **WELCOME AND INTRODUCTIONS** – *Leslie Hunter, Vice- Chair*
The November 10, 2016 Health County meeting was called to order at 9:02 a.m., at which time around the table introductions occurred and quorum was confirmed.
2. **CONSIDER APPROVAL OF AGENDA** – *Leslie Hunter, Vice- Chair*

4. **PUBLIC COMMENT**
None at this time.
5. **STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE** – *Jill Cook, Deputy County Administrator*
 - **Tobacco Initiative:** There were some ballot initiatives of interest that passed, including the one regarding tobacco, which hopefully coupled with that state initiative of labeling e-cigarettes as tobacco products will provide the potential for increased revenue.
 - **Flavored Tobacco Ordinance:** The County recently passed an ordinance prohibiting the sale of flavored tobacco in the unincorporated areas of the County. This ordinance will go into effect in the Spring of 2017.
 - **Marijuana Initiatives:** Due to the recent changes in the State law, the conversation around marijuana will continue.
 - **Child Welfare Services:** The final Child Welfare Services workshop will be taking place on November 22nd. This final workshop will review the previous workshops and possibly make recommendations moving forward.
6. **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE** - *Tara Thronson, Assistant Deputy to Supervisor Saylor*
 - **Marijuana Initiatives:** The Board of Supervisors will continue the conversation in regards to marijuana on November 22nd, including a fee structure for cost recovery. Marijuana will be a long term conversation as the needs of all involved are identified and discussed.

- **Flavored Tobacco Ordinance:** The flavored tobacco ban was a significant effort that included discussion and concerns from retailers. The data shows that tobacco use has tripled since 2007. Enforcement is going well.
- **Sugar Sweetened Beverage Consumption Reduction:** There is a group being pulled together to look at sugar sweetened beverage consumption reduction efforts. Dr. Chapman will share more information about that.

7. **COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT** – *Jan Babb, Community Health Branch Director*

- **Appointed Members:** Jan Babb informed the appointed members that terms end after the January meeting. Ashley will be following up with the appointed members to determine if anyone would like to be reappointed and will send the information to the appropriate Supervisor's office for approval.
- **Tobacco Initiative:** Jan shared some additional information regarding Prop 56, the tobacco tax measure. The American Lung Association has provided an update announcing that the tax will go take effect April 1, 2017 and it should lead to a tripling of the current tobacco control budget. Yolo County should see an impact on the local Tobacco program. In addition, it will quadruple lung cancer research funding, as well as increase school based tobacco prevention activities.
- **Moving Beyond Depression:** Training was just completed for Moving Beyond Depression. The training was attended by internal staff, partner agencies, and a neighboring County. Moving Beyond Depression is an evidenced based intervention for perinatal mood and anxiety disorders for mothers participating in home visiting programs. In Yolo County, that will include participants in the Nurse Home Visiting, Adolescent Family Life Program (AFLP), and Step by Step programs. CommuniCare Health Centers is an important partner in this effort.
- **CMSP Mini-Grants:** The CMSP program has released an RFP for mini-grants for up to \$20,000. Applications can be submitted from Counties and community based organizations. More information can be found on the [CMSP website](#).
- **Accreditation Update:** On October 27, 2016, there was a joint CHIP workgroup which included participants from the three priorities areas; Healthy Aging, Chronic Disease Prevention, and Mental Health. These joint meetings include looking at incoming data on the measures and review of the process. There is work being done on a CHIP Annual Report, which will be completed in January. Internally, work is being done on a Community Health Branch Workforce Development Plan. This included a staff survey for the branch, as well as an agency wide employee satisfaction survey. Based on that data, the Branch leadership is looking at gaps around competencies and are working on strategies to address those gaps. In addition, a huge effort is happening to gather the required PHAB documentation. At this point, 44% of the required documentation has been submitted and has gone through an internal approval process.

8. **HEALTH OFFICER REPORT** – *Dr. Ron Chapman, Health Officer*

- **Tobacco Initiative:** From a public health officer standpoint, it has been proven multiple times that increasing the tax on tobacco is one of the most powerful strategies for reducing consumption.
- **Sugar Sweetened Beverage Consumption Reduction:** Three cities in the Bay Area passed a 1 cent per ounce soda tax; San Francisco, Oakland, and Albany. In addition, Boulder, Colorado passed a 2 cent per ounce soda tax. There was a workgroup meeting this morning that included Supervisor Saylor, Harold Goldstein and others to discuss efforts in Yolo County.
- **Flu Season:** Flu season is just beginning and data is starting to be tracked. It is a great time to remind everyone to get vaccinated. Vaccinations protect those most vulnerable such as children, pregnant women and seniors.

- **Oral Health:** Monday was the first Oral Health Strategic Plan Steering Committee meeting. This group is tasked with developing a 3 -5 year oral health strategic plan for the county; which should be complete with the next six months with the help of a consultant. There will be an all-day event to gather additional information.

- The Suicide Prevention Crisis Line has been in Yolo County for 50 years, and has increased from one crisis line in Davis to numerous crisis lines.
- In 2012, Yolo County became 1 of 10 centers in California in the Suicide Prevention Network.

11. HEPATITIS C REPORT – Ron Chapman, Public Health Officer

- Dr. Chapman provided a brief history and overview of Hepatitis C. Hep C is a virus that is spread most commonly through sharing of needles of IV drug uses; however, prior to 1992, when testing blood for Hep C started, a significant number of individuals were at risk due to history of blood transfusion. It can take up to six months for symptoms to show up for this virus, if at all. Many of the baby boomers are now being diagnosed with Hep C, with the expected peak of diagnosis to be around 2030.
- Treatment has just become successful in the last few years with the development of antivirals, but can be very expensive. Data is not available on how many of those diagnosed are actually receiving treatment.


