

The Library Regional Manager reports to the Fiscal Administrative Officer and oversees a cluster of branches in the East Yolo Region, consisting of the Yolo Branch Library, Arthur F. Turner Community Library, Knights Landing Branch Library, and Clarksburg Branch Library. This position works with a diverse team of professionals, paraprofessionals and community members to deliver quality service and programming in rural and urban areas to support and engage residents in the region.

Additionally, the Library Regional Manager develops and administers policies concerning library operations, budgets, and programs, engages in the Library's strategic directions and committees, assesses and analyzes community needs and program outcomes, evaluates staff performances, cultivates partnerships with community stakeholders, supports the Friends of the Library and more.



All library staff in this class are expected to provide direct service at any branch and be able to work regular evening and weekend hours.









About the County

Yolo County is one of California's original 27 counties and is home to over 200,000 people. Nearly 85% of the population lives in the County's four cities: Davis, West Sacramento, Winters and Woodland. Traditionally, farming and ranching activities have played an important role in making Yolo County one of the leading agricultural producers in the nation.

There are excellent leisure and cultural opportunities, such as the Woodland Opera House and the Mondavi Center, whitewater rafting along Cache Creek, bicycling on scenic country roads, and fishing and water-skiing along the Sacramento River. If you like adventure, you can easily enjoy the nearby Sierra Nevada mountains, Northern California coast, San Francisco Bay Area, and the Napa Valley wine country. The County is also home to the University of California, Davis with its 5,300-acre campus and 36,000 student population.

The Yolo County Library serves seven communities and the rural areas of Yolo County, and provides public library services to all areas of the County except the City of Woodland. Branch libraries are located in Clarksburg, Davis, Esparto, West Sacramento, Knights Landing, Winters and Yolo. Library Administration, Technical Services and operations are located in Woodland.

Public library services include collection management, circulation, Internet access, reserves and interlibrary loans, virtual branch and database services, computer and software applications, meeting and study rooms, diverse programs for all ages, homework and research assistance, literacy programming, reference and information services and instruction, family and children resources, Archives and Records Center services and preservation and more.
