SPECIALTY MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES
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HHSA- Specialty Mental Health Services

- Children and Adult Specialty Mental Health Services are provided to consumers
 who are severely mentally ill (SMI) or severely emotionally disturbed (SED) based
 on their diagnosis, their medical necessity and their level of functioning
- These services are provided to Yolo County residents who have Medi-Cal and/or Medicare benefits, or who are indigent

How Clients Access Services

- Clients/Families call the Access Line
- Clients/Families are referred by their outside provider
- Clients are referred by Beacon
- Other Access points within HHSA: Walk-in, Crisis Clinician, Discharge Planning, Homeless Team, Probation, APS and CWS

Triage Services

- Initial screening to ensure that individuals are linked to the correct level of care and support
- First point of contact for individuals seeking mental health services
- Allows for timely access to appropriate mental health care
- During a triage clients are screened to determine the severity of mental health symptoms:
 - · History of risk indicators
 - · History of psychiatric symptoms and behaviors
 - · Changes in mood or activity, or a significant deterioration in basis functioning
 - Psychiatric hospitalization history
 - History of substance abuse

Triage Services

- Clients whose needs can be met by a lower level of care will be referred to an outside provider
- Clients who meet criteria for Specialty Mental Health Services will be referred for an assessment through Yolo County HHSA / Alcohol Drug and Mental Health for further evaluation on diagnosis, significant impairments, and specific interventions required to improve the condition
- Based on the outcome/ recommendation of the assessment the client will be referred to the appropriate team or contracted provider

Teams

Adult Moderate Intensity Team

 Clinic based specialty mental health services for SMI adults, but can also include intermittent field based case management services to maintain linkage to psychiatric care and community resources.

Adult Full Service Partnership Team

• An intensive and comprehensive clinic or field-based mental health service for individuals experiencing significant serious mental illness (SMI).

Older Adult Team

 Provides both Moderate Intensity services and Full Service Partnership for clients 60 and older

Teams

Adult Forensic Team

• Forensic Services include Mental Health Court, mental health and substance use disorder assessments of individuals in custody/incarcerated, and misdemeanant competency restoration services.

Homeless Services Team

 A wide array of collaborations and interventions for individuals experiencing homelessness in Yolo County. Services also include outreach, addressing immediate/critical needs, and assuring linkage to an appropriate system of care.

Teams

Transitional Age Youth Services

 Provides both Moderate Intensity services and Full Service Partnership for clients (ages 18-24)

Wellness Center

 Designed for both transition-age youth and adults. Offers a variety of rehabilitative services, skill-building groups, and a computer labs with internet access. Consumers are encouraged to engage in wellness and recovery activities. The Wellness Centers are drug- and alcohol-free environment.

Children's Mental Health Team

• Provides both Moderate to Severe Intensity services for clients (ages 0-25) involved with Child Welfare Services.
