1) Welcome & Introductions

- Emily welcomed the group and around the table introductions were completed.
- In order to help orient new participants to the CHIP, prior to this meeting was a CHIP 101 session. Although this will not be offered at every meeting, it is something we hope to offer once or twice a year.

2) Data Sharing

- Updated data can be found in the Dashboard on www.HealthyYolo.com.
- Eat Well Yolo Program
 - This produce distribution program partners with family resource centers and community centers to distribute produce to individuals. Previously, this program was only open to families with children under the age of 5, however this is now open to anyone and they will receive 8-10 pounds of produce. While the produce is typically received through a partnership with the California Association of Food Banks, the program is now looking to work with local farmers to provide seasonal produce.
 - The program does tend to see a decrease around the holidays due to the additional program and providers that provide assistance around that time.
 - There is typically an increase around September due to the work with local famers and that is harvest season.
 - Eat Well Yolo has recently hired a full time procurement specialist, which should increase the efforts of working with local farmers.

• UC Cooperative Extension

- As the smallest County Department and funded through three sources, the Cooperative Extension is a nutrition education program. Partnering with NEOP, this program provides nutrition, physical health, and hygiene education in schools. The schools that receive this resource are low income schools. In order to provide this education, teachers and other adults are trained to provide the training.
- Target: the target is to maintain these number, as the program is expanding into policy, system, and environmental changes.

• Multipurpose Senior Services Program (MSSP)

 MSSP is a regional program that includes several Counties. There are 276 slots available for the region.

• Hispanic Medi-Cal Beneficiaries Served

• This data is provided from the state, which causes a delay in data. HHSA is looking for a way to track and analyze the data internally.

• Follow Up Appointments

- This is a percentage calculated on total hospital discharges but does not take into account the follow up appointments that other agencies may have provided.
- Yolo County HHSA has awarded funding to CommuniCare Health Centers to provide services around diabetes self-management. After this program is established, they will be invited to join the CHIP.

3) Collective Impact

- The focus for the second year of the CHIP will be collective impact. Given the dwindling resources, how do we come together to find those mutually reinforcing areas to have meaningful impact and change?
