#### 4. PUBLIC COMMENT

#### 5. MCAH DIRECTOR'S REPORT – Jan Babb

- Jan discussed the current Medi-Cal enrollment numbers. There were about 20,000 individuals added to Medi-Cal expansion, which is something to keep in mind as the situation at the federal level changes. CMSP is the indigent health care program, which if they roll back the Medi-Cal expansion, the numbers would increase. CMSP is not as comprehensive as Medi-Cal in that is does not have as many preventative services.
- Norovirus: There has been a significant Norovirus outbreak in Yolo County schools with about 1,000 children and teachers who have been infected. Washington Unified School District and Woodland Joint Unified School District have been hit the hardest. The Communicable Disease team is working closing with CDPH, CDC, and the school districts. In order to curb the spread of the disease, good hygiene practices are very important; hand washing with soap and water, cleaning surfaces with bleach. - Botulism: There have been nine cases of botulism in Sacramento County tied to gas station nacho cheese. A <u>Health</u>
   <u>Alert</u> has gone out from Yolo County. There are some concerns about the similar symptoms between Norovirus and
   Botulism.
- **Health Council** has become interested in focusing on adolescent health in the future. This effort is still in the planning phase but may become a half day summit. It was suggested that MCAH Advisory Board assist in the planning. In addition, it was suggested that it might be beneficial to have students involved in the event.
