July Programs at the West Sacramento Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) – All are welcome to participate in the following special programs held during the month of July at Yolo County's Arthur F. Turner Community Library, located at 1212 Merkley Avenue in West Sacramento:

- Summer Reading Program 2017: Reading By Design: May 26 August 19. Come for prizes, activities, and fun. Visit the library to sign up and receive a free gift! Find out more at: <u>www.yolocounty.org</u>.
- **Read off Your Fines!: May 26 August 19.** This year, the Read Off Your Fines campaign will be held in conjunction with the Summer Reading Program. Young adults and children (ages 17 and under) will be able to deduct \$1.00 from their fines for every 15 minutes spent reading a book of their choice in the library and also use those minutes toward earning incentives in the Summer Reading Program.
- July 1, 6, 15, 20 & 29: Tech Help 1-On-1, 11:00 a.m. Do you want to learn how to get the best out of your laptop, tablet, or smartphone? Bring your questions and get answers in a 20 minute 1-on-1 session with our tech help. Sessions are by appointment only. Please register at the Information desk or by calling (916) 375-6465.
- July 5: Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA), 11:00 a.m. Come and meet a representative from the Yolo County Health & Human Services Agency to learn about adult and dislocated worker training services. WIOA will be at the library once a month.
- July 6 & 20: All Things String, 6:00 p.m. This crafting circle is for anyone who knits, crochets, embroiders, or enjoys fiber art. Bring a project or start something new.
- July 10: Love on a Leash, 4:00 p.m. Children (ages 6-12) are invited to join us for a fun "Read to a Dog" program. Love on a Leash® (LOAL) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to providing an avenue for volunteer pet therapy teams to engage in meaningful and productive animal assisted therapy. Parents/caregivers are asked to stay with their child to help with the reading. After 10 visits a participant can choose a free book.
- July 11: Discovery Bottle Surprise, 4:00 p.m. Children (ages 6-12) and their parents/caregivers are

- July 20: Baby and Me Art Class, 11:00 a.m. Children (ages 0-12 months) and their parents or caregivers are invited to make a mess creating art projects using a variety of materials. In this hands-on environment, babies will explore their creative side and foster their learning of colors, shapes, and more! Parent/caregiver participation is required.
- July 20: Duct Tape Engineering and Bent Object Art, 4:00 p.m. Tweens and teens (ages 13-17) are invited to come and participate in this maker box activity. Design your own project or create your own art object. Materials will be provided.
