## **STAFFING**

### HOMELESSNESS

In last May, the Health and Human Services Agency hosted a half-day Coordinated Entry Kickoff Meeting for the Homeless system of care in Yolo County, which was attended by more than 30 participants. The four-hour session was intended to inform the design and implementation of a coordinated entry system, which is a system-wide process of prioritizing homeless assistance based on vulnerability and severity of need to ensure that people who need assistance the most can receive it in a timely manner. The meeting was facilitated by external consultants from HomeBase and began with an overview of the purpose of coordinated entry. The consultants then facilitated an in-depth discussion to identify the key entry points into the Yolo homeless system of care, which is the critical first step in ensuring that any person experiencing homelessness can easily access the system. The session also facilitated a discussion about the assessment and prioritization tools that would be used in the system. At the close of the session the group agreed to form a subcommittee to keep the development of the local coordinated entry system moving forward. The group will meet monthly to continue progress, with the goal of having a fully implemented system by January of 2018.

### **COMMUNITY GARDEN**

In honor of Farm to Fork Month (September), the garden will be hosting a farm to fork garden academy, which includes a series of classes on gardening topics offered each Wednesday evening in September.
