September Programs at the West Sacramento Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) – All are welcome to participate in the following special programs held during the month of September at Yolo County's Arthur F. Turner Community Library, located at 1212 Merkley Avenue in West Sacramento:

- **September is Library Card Sign-Up Month!** Come sign up for a card and check out all we have to offer, from books, DVDs, special programs, and much more!
- Latino Heritage Month: September 15 October 15. Celebrate Hispanic heritage! This is a special national event.
- **Mobile Wi-Fi Hotspot & Chromebooks.** These are now available for check out. Contact the library for details.
- September 6: Workforce Innovation & Opportunity Act (WIOA), 11:00 a.m. Come and meet a representative from the Yolo County Health & Human Services Agency to learn about adult and dislocated worker training services. WIOA will be at the library once a month.
