Library's 'LEST WE FORGET' Project Shares Part Two in the Story of Yolo County Residents in World War I

(Woodland, CA) – The Yolo County Library invites the community to attend the second presentation in the “LEST WE FORGET” series. This four part series, which began earlier this year, reveals the story of Yolo County during World War I. Now residents are encouraged to experience part two, entitled “In it for the Long Haul”.

In part two of the series, the presentations focus locally on how Yolo County’s “boys” were disbursed throughout the nation for training, the need for constant fundraising, and the formation of ultra-patriotic groups.
