Recommended Action

Reason for Recommended Action

This information is to provide the Commission with an overview of the proposals and projects for the present year and those projected for next year in relation to budget and time management.

Background

Throughout fiscal year 2007/08 the Yolo LAFCO will have initiated and considered a wide range of municipal service reviews and spheres of influence studies for ten special districts and three cities. In addition, by the end of this fiscal year, the Commission will have reviewed proposals for various boundary changes and organizational projects. Staff continues to research revisions to the Commission's housing policy and updates to conflict of interest policies. The specifics of the current and projected work are as follows:

Conclusion

The Yolo LAFCO should complete all required municipal service review and sphere of influence studies by the end of fiscal year 2007-08. Although this will not meet the deadline of January 1, 2008 the remaining agencies have no pending boundary changes and so will see no detrimental effects. LAFCO staff will continue to oversee contract management for the four consultant projects in addition to completing three in-house studies. Staff continues to receive training and education on LAFCO law, procedures and process. The team approach to implementation of policy, processing applications and special studies continues to be an efficient and advantageous method to do business. Staff continues to abide by the mission statement and core values adopted by the Commission, as reflected in Attachment B.

The next fiscal year should provide opportunity to reevaluate the adopted sphere of influence studies. The evaluation will consider more governance and efficiency issues based on previous finding and changes in the reviewed agency since the previous study. The service review and sphere of influence study schedule for completion of the studies is attached, the work plan outlined in this memo depicts staffs suggestions for reviewing existing sphere studies.
