

### Pregnant Women - Data We Don't Have

- Hospitalizations for mental health (MH) or substance abuse in pregnancy
- Very difficult to write code and pregnancy status may not be recorded
- Family Health Outcomes Project (FHOP) updated for 5-year needs assessment, last available year 2014
- Not all OB/GYNs are screening for PMADs
- Primary care data on prevalence of MH/substance/opioid use in pregnancy
- Primary care women wellness visits (age 15-44)

#### Infants - Data We Don't Have

- 3-mo exclusive and any breastfeeding (WIC data are 2-mo-olds)
- Our data are only for WIC infants
