In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agriculture Code, I hereby submit the Yolo County Agricultural Crop Report for the 1983 calendar year.

Yolo County's gross value of agricultural production for 1983 was \$162,209,300. This represents a reduction of \$43,699,700 or 27% from the previous year's total of \$205,909,000. This was the second year in succession that there has been a considerable decrease in gross value of agriculture production in Yolo County.

A major factor responsible for this reduction in 1983 was the large number of acres idled by growers participating in the Federal Payment-In-Kind (PIK) Program and other Federal Set-Aside Programs. Approximately 85,000 acres were taken out of production through these Federal programs. It should be noted that the value of income derived through these programs is not included in this report. Another factor contributing to the decrease in gross returns was heavy spring rain, which reduced the yields of fruit and nut crops and delayed the planting of row crops.

Crop values in this report are gross receipts to growers and should not be confused with net income. It should be pointed out that for the past several years, production costs have continued to increase, while the prices received for agricultural commodities have remained about the same or have decreased.

Agriculture continues to be the number one industry in Yolo County despite the many hardships producers face each year. SO far this year, weather conditions appear more favorable for farming; and, hopefully, 1984 will result in large gross returns to Yolo County growers.

My sincere appreciation is extended to the many individuals, firms and agencies who provided the information necessary to make this report possible. I wish to specifically recognize Agricultural Biologist Frank Carl of this office for the long hours and hard work he has devoted to compiling the statistics necessary for this report.
