Women Infants and Children (WIC)

- The Yolo County Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Program participates annually in the Farmers' Market Nutrition Program (FMNP). This year we distributed 1996 coupons to 499 families in Woodland, West Sacramento and Davis. Overall, 52% of those coupons were redeemed in the County equating to \$5,175 for Farmers participating in the program. Separated by City, Davis lead the way with redemption at 62%. The FMNP coupons are in addition to the fruit and vegetable checks that WIC families receive monthly that can be redeemed at participating Farmers' Markets as well as WIC authorized grocery stores.

Emergency Medical Services Agency & Emergency Preparedness

- Susan Hensley recently completed a Strategic National Stockpile Preparedness training offered by the Center for Domestic Preparedness (CDP), in Anniston, Ala. The CDP is operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency and is the only federally-chartered Weapons of Mass Destruction (WMD) training facility in the nation. The CDP develops and delivers advanced training for emergency response providers, emergency managers, and other government officials from state, local, and tribal governments. Training at the CDP campus is federally funded at no cost to state, local, and tribal emergency response professionals or their agency. The Strategic National Stockpile Preparedness Course is a five-day course designed to give Federal, State, and local representatives information on how to best plan and prepare for a public health emergency and how to use and manage the Strategic National Stockpile in response to a terrorist attack, natural disaster, or technological accident.

Health Education

- Tobacco Retail Licensing – Between May and July 2017, the District Attorney's Office conducted their first, second, and third round of tobacco decoy stings in Winters as a result of the Tobacco Retail Licensing ordinance adopted by the Winters City Council. While a handful of Winters tobacco retailers illegally sold tobacco to underage decoys, most retailers successfully declined to sell.
- Car Seat Safety – The Car Seat Safety program will be participating in briefing training sessions with Winters Police Department in March. These sessions are aimed to inform law enforcement on what to look for during a traffic stop regarding the correct installation and usage of car seats.

Law enforcement will be able to advise parents where to get education on installing car seats correctly such as the appropriate time to graduate their child to the next car seat or seat belt.

- The Car Seat Safety program will be installing a new car seat recycle container at the Winters services center. Too many unsafe seats such as those that have expired, having missing parts, and/or have been involved in a crash are handed down to families or friends when they should be removed from usage. The new recycling container will provide a location for all families to drop off old seats to be properly disposed of. These seats will be later taken to the Davis recycling center for processing where the plastic will be used for other products. Car Seat recycling centers are also in place in Woodland and soon to be in West Sacramento.
