### 9:00 A.M. CALL TO ORDER

### 4. PUBLIC COMMENT

- John Troidl will be attending a conference in Santa Clara County on the use of technology to support caregivers for seniors.
- Dr. Thomas Cahill spoke briefly on the health effects of air pollution and the Clean Air Act of 1997.

## 5. STATE AND COUNTY UPDATE - Jill Cook, CAO's Office

- Housing Development: The housing development located at 180 W. Beamer Street, Woodland, is funded by Mental Health Services Act (MHSA). We hope to have people moving in the apartments this summer.
- Knights Landing Youth: Public Health staff is working with stakeholders in Knights Landing, and taking the public health approach to community engagement to identify some opportunities for youth development and youth leadership.
- Board of Supervisors 2018 Legislative Platform, enhanced and expanded this year with a category under Health and Human Services Agency, both Federal and State support increased funding and expanded eligibility criteria for SNAP/CalFresh benefits and oppose any federal SNAP funding cuts.

## 6. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS UPDATE – Assistant Deputy Jessica Jones

- **Cannabis:** At the March 6<sup>th</sup> Board of Supervisor's meeting, the Board approved language for the June 2018 ballot, for a General Tax Measure on commercial cannabis. The Board also reviewed and provided direction on the following:
  - Citizen Oversight Committee
  - Early Implementation Development Agreements
  - Comprehensive Land Use Regulations
- Laura's Law Program: At the Board of Supervisor's meeting on February 20<sup>th</sup> the Board received an update on Laura's Law, the Assisted Outpatient Treatment (AOT) Program. To date, 16 individuals have received services in Yolo County and 12 individuals have been successfully discharged from the program.
- Child Welfare Service Plan: At the March 6<sup>th</sup> Board of Supervisor's meeting, HHSA gave a presentation on the Child Welfare Services Action Plan. Social Workers are working hard to improve the health and safety of all youth. There are changes in state regulations, and the department is actively working on these challenges. One of the greatest challenges is Resource Family Approval, and now with state law changes, relatives are required to attend the same training requirements as the general foster families.

March is National Social Worker month, and the board expressed great appreciation for the Child Welfare Services workers and the work they do.

## 7. COMMUNITY HEALTH BRANCH REPORT – Mimi Hall, Community Health Director Branch Report

- Jail Medical Contract: The Community Health Branch oversees the Jail Medical contract, which started in December 2016, and provides medical and behavioral health services to both the adult and juvenile facilities. Raquel Aguilar, Senior Public Health Nurse with HHSA, will take on the role of jail inspections, quality assurance, and be the liaison between the facilities and Public Health.
- Women Infants and Children (WIC): WIC participates annually in the Farmers Market Nutrition Program (FMNP), and this year we distributed 1996 vouchers to 499 residents in Yolo County. The FMNP coupons are in addition to the fruit and vegetable checks WIC families receive monthly that can be redeemed at participating Farmers Markets and WIC authorized grocery stores.
- Emergency Medical Services Agency & Emergency Preparedness: Susan Hensley recently completed a Strategic National Stockpile Preparedness training offered by the Center for Domestic Preparedness (DCP), in Anniston, Alabama. The CDP is operated by the United States Department of Homeland Security's Federal Emergency Management Agency and is the only federally-chartered Weapons of Mass Destruction training facility in the nation. The CDP develops and delivers advanced training for emergency response providers, emergency managers, and other government officials from state, local, and tribal governments.
- Health Education: Steve Jensen is working with the Winters Police Department to have the Car Seat Safety Program participate in brief training sessions in March. The sessions are aimed to inform law enforcement on what to look for during a traffic stop, regarding the correct installation and usage of car seats. The Car Seat Safety Program currently has a car seat recycle container in Woodland, and will soon install a new recycle container at the Service Centers in both Winters and West Sacramento.

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8. HEALTH OFFICER REPORT – Ron Chapman, Heath Officer

- **Community Health Branch Director:** Ron stated starting April 2, he will be stepping in to serve as the Interim Director for the Community Health Branch, just until the new Branch Director is hired.
- **Tuberculosis (TB):** Yolo County has 4 new active cases of TB.
- **Oral Health:** The committee is very active now that we have funding coming in to create an oral health program in our county. One of the first activities we are planning is to have an Oral Health Policy Summit, on May 18<sup>th</sup>, inviting elected officials, healthcare leaders, school officials, and some Health Council members. We will be looking at how to implement the strategic plan especially around creating policy agenda.
