- May 1, 2018 kicks off Mental Health and Maternal Mental Health Awareness Month! Yolo County's Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) and Yolo County MCAH programs Maternal Mental Health are partnering up for some new looks this year cobranding of the Green Ribbon (Every Mind Matters) and Blue Dot Campaign! The goal is to reduce stigma, increase awareness and engagement around mental health disorders. Up to 1 in 5 mothers in California will suffer symptoms of perinatal mood or anxiety disorder and nearly everyone is impacted or knows someone struggling with mental health symptoms or a disorder. Positive Youth Development - On April 12, the Maternal, Child & Adolescent Health Program Coordinator convened a workgroup focused on a project to address issues surrounding infrastructure for Positive Youth Development in Knights Landing. Positive Youth Development refers to intentional efforts of other youth, adults, communities, government agencies, and schools to provide opportunities for youth to enhance their interests, skills, and abilities. This initiative is the first of its kind to organize various agencies in Knights Landing using a collective impact approach. Community partners include Empower Yolo, Community Service District, UC Davis Youth Enrichment Program, Yolo County Office of Education, Taller Arte del Nuevo Amanecer (TANA), Woodland Joint Unified School District, District 5 Office, Yolo County Administrator's Office, Friday Night Live, and the Maternal, Child, and Adolescent Health program. The workgroup's key function is to identify additional community partners, assess gaps/needs, and map resources. The workgroup hopes to achieve this by bringing together partners already serving the community and seeking funding to increase services. At this first meeting, the group identified opportunities for increased youth outreach, current strengths of partner organizations, as well as current barriers. Health Education

• Friday Night Live – Winters High School (WHS) Friday Night Live (FNL) and River City High School (RCHS) FNL are promoting May is Mental Health Awareness month by having students sign a pledge banner that says "Awareness Matters". At both schools, there will be a lunch time event, Thursday May 17th at RCHS and Friday May 18th at WHS, with Mental Health resources available to students. WHS will have several guest speakers talking to the entire student body (500 students) that mental health is essential to everyone's overall health and well-being. The featured guest speaker will be Miss California 2017, Jillian Smith. All staff at both schools will be given a lime green ribbon to wear in support of May is Mental Health Awareness month, and students will be given lime green wristbands to wear.

Lastly, on May 1st, Pioneer High School & Douglass Middle School has completed the FNL Mentoring program for 2017-2018. Twelve (12) high school students mentored 12 middle school students once a week for 1 ½ hours since October 2017. They completed 21 sessions. Topics included effects and consequences of using alcohol, tobacco, and marijuana, self-esteem, health, friendships, teambuilding and mental health, and many others.
