## June Programs at the West Sacramento Branch Library

(Woodland, CA) – This June join Yolo County's Arthur F. Turner Community Library to participate in a variety of special programs. The activities are open to all at the library which is located at 1212 Merkley Avenue in West Sacramento.

- **June is Pride Month!** Join us to recognize, celebrate, and support the LGBTQ+ community, history, and culture. Pride month commemorates the 1969 Stonewall riots in New York and the history of gay rights and related civil rights movements. Check out our book display and bibliography.
- Summer Reading Program 2018: Reading Takes You Everywhere: May 20 August 18: Sign up and get a free book! Choose your summer challenge: read 10 books, or read for 10 hours, or read for 10 days. There will be activities, events, and prizes all summer long.
- Read off Your Fines: May 20 August 18: The Read Off Your Fines campaign will be held in conjunction with the Summer Reading Program. Young adults and children (ages 17 and under) will be able to deduct \$1.00 from their fines for every 15 minutes spent reading a book of their choice in the library and also use those minutes toward earning incentives in the Summer Reading Program.
- June 1: I SEE YOU Art Show, 4:00 p.m. Join us at the library for an art exhibit hosted by the Yolo Arts Group featuring the work of I SEE YOU participants. This special event is the culmination of an eight-week library workshop. I SEE YOU is a YoloArts project funded by a grant from the James Irvine Foundation's Exploring Engagement Fund. The project seeks to increase community engagement through the arts among people experiencing homelessness in Yolo County, while raising awareness for participants throughout the region by saying I SEE YOU.
- **June 3: VR Travel, 1:00 p.m.** Come for an interactive and fun Virtual Reality Program. Sit back and relax and take city tours of Paris, London, and many more even Sacramento! It will be like you're actually there. Ages 18 and over.
- June 6 & 20: Teen Club (Teen Room), 5:00 p.m. Teens (ages 13-18) are invited to participate in our bi-weekly program at the library focused on developing leadership skills through engaging activities. Snacks will be provided.
- June 7: Fair Housing Pop-Up Clinic, 4:00 p.m. Join us for a free pop-up housing clinic outside the Community Room. Learn more about fair housing laws as well as the most recent developments in related topics such as: sexual harassment, criminal history protections, racial discrimination, disability,

and new state-protected categories. Come with questions.

- June 7: Author Talk: Marilyn Reynolds, 6:00 p.m. Local author Marilyn Reynolds will discuss her memoir, *Till Death or Dementia Do Us Part*, which focuses on her husband's experiences with frontotemporal dementia (FTD). Join us. Light snacks will be provided.
- June 8: Therapeutic Tai Chi and Qi Gong Part XXX, 4:00 p.m. Learn a series of movements and breathing exercises for general wellness, stress relief, physical balance, flexibility, and fall prevention. In part XXX, we shall begin to learn the twelve Yijin Jing qi gong exercises. Two new movements will be taught in each session. These movements are recognized as a set of exercises for healing and well-being in Chinese medicine. Come in comfortable clothing; floor mats and chairs will be provided. New participants are welcome and no registration is required.
