



What is 3D printing?

3D printing, or additive manufacturing, is a process of making three-dimensional objects from a digital file. The Yolo County Library offers access to 3D printers that use the process of material extrusion, where plastic filament is extruded though a heated nozzle, layer by layer.

3D printing allows individuals to participate in small manufacture projects. The printers can be used to build objects from figurines to jewelry to household tools.



3D printer guidelines

- 1. Yolo County Library's 3D printers may be used only for lawful purposes. 3D printers may NOT be used for the creation of material that is:
 - a. Illegal—Prohibited by an local, state or federal law;
 - b. Unsafe or dangerous including, but not limited to: guns, knives, weapons of any kind:
 - c. Obscene or otherwise inappropriate for the library environment;
 - d. Under copyright, patent, trademark, or otherwise legally protected.
- The Library reserves the right to refuse any 3D print
- Use of the 3D printers is open to all Yolo County Library cardholders age 13 and older who are in good standing, have viewed the Library's suggested instructional video(s) or have sufficient prior experience with 3D printers, and have signed and completed the attached User Agreement and Liability Waiver.
- 3D printing at the Library is currently free, but a fee may be charged in the future to cover the printing costs.
- Patrons may be charged for damages to library equipment. This cost will cover repair or replacement of the damaged equipment (up to \$2,500 for the printer, up to \$2,000 for the laptop).
- The Library is not responsible for any loss of data or damage to the user's equipment arising from the use of its computers or network.

Procedures

- In order to use Yolo County Library's 3D printers, individuals must first::
 - View the instructional video(s) posted on the Library's website, or have sufficient prior experience to use the printer safely and appropriately.

- Complete and sign the attached User Agreement and Liability Waiver.
- Individuals are responsible for obtaining designs to be printed and ensuring files are saved in the most current file format.
- Individuals may only use the filament provided.
- The 3D printers should not be left unattended.
- No food or drink are allowed when working with the 3D printers.
- All equipment should be properly stored after use.

Appointments:

- Individuals may reserve a 3 hour appointment to use the 3D printer by contacting the Information Desk (3D printer hours listed on back).
- For files that will take longer than 2 hours to print, patrons must reserve back-to-back appointments. Projects must be finished in no more than 5 hours.
- Individuals can book up to 4 sessions per month.
- Appointments are available on a first-come, first-served basis, and may be made up to one month in advance.
- Library staff may be available for some troubleshooting assistance, but will not be able to provide individual instruction.
- Group appointments may be made at the discretion of library staff.
