Overview:

April 2018 revenues for Wild Wings Golf Course were \$8,662 below budget and were \$2,464 short of the prior year. Rounds of golf for the month were 989 rounds short of projections and 254 rounds ahead of the prior year. Green fee/cart fee revenues fell short of projections by \$6,397 due to missed rounds projections. Merchandise sales were short of budget by \$486, while Food and Beverage sales were \$1,768 short of budget. The NOI for the month lost \$2,431 to budget projections. Payroll for the month was \$2,873 over budget, while Operating Expenses came in \$8,994 under budget. Payroll was over budget due to extra man-hours needed to irrigate the golf course and operate alternative pumping facilities due to the downed water plant operations. (See payroll breakdown on monthly financials)

Converted rounds: 1,006 of the 1,825 rounds recorded for April were 18 hole rounds. Converting those rounds to 9 hole rounds resulted in a total of 2,831 rounds for April. Total converted rounds for the fiscal year are 24,950.



Key Operational Highlights:

• There were six events scheduled during the month - Two SIR's event with a total of 80 players, two Men's Club event with 16 players, a GCSA tournament with 20 players and a DOJ tournament with 12 players

Course & Grounds:

- Re-seeded divots on tees.
- Sprayed weeds in parking lot.
- Cleaned around Kirby fairway yardage markers.
- Replaced burned out communication unit in irrigation satellite.
- Removed tree stakes from large self-standing trees.
- Placed new trash bucket on #9 tee.
- Replaced tire on rough mower.
- Installed new electric coils on triplex greensmower.
- Sharpened rotary blades on rough mower.
- Put Sonar in lakes to control cattails.
- Fixed broken irrigation pipes on holes #1,4 & 5.
- Replaced worn solenoid plungers in leaking Rainbird fairway sprinklers on holes #6 & #7.
- Replaced flags on large putting greens and practice green.

Personnel

• No changes were made to golf course personnel during the month of April.

General

- Continue to improve golf cart fleet maintenance.
- Seats have arrived and 20 have been replaced. The remaining 10 carts will be completed as they are re-covered.

Key Actions to Drive Performance:

- Re-arranged Golf Shop merchandise displays.
- Called tournament groups from past events to obtain bookings for 2018-19.

Key property action steps by management to drive performance:

- Running e-mail promotions to promote weekday tee times
- Weekly Sales calls to groups for booking events
- Use of online coupons on Wild Wings website for monthly specials
- Continue to work on booking banquet events for the Nest.
- Beginning to search for Food Truck(s) to service golfers and residents.
