Background

The Rural Community Investment program is a mechanism for advancing unaddressed programs, policies and initiatives in rural unincorporated areas that meet one of two objectives: economic development or health and safety. Over the course of 2016-17, staff from the County Administrator’s Office and Yolo County Housing gathered information on the interests of the rural communities in an effort to determine potential County and grant funding resources. Information was gathered through conducting town meetings in Dunnigan, Yolo, and Zamora. Several communities had already developed action plans listing the needs for their communities. Therefore, staff also reviewed the needs identified in the action plans of Capay Valley, Clarksburg and Knights Landing.

After gathering input from the communities, staff reached out to County department heads to determine additional needs in the rural areas and reviewed the Yolo County Agricultural Labor Study. Overall, common themes among the rural communities were a desire for high speed internet, town hall improvements, equipment for local fire departments, and greater police presence. Once the needs were identified, Consero Solutions, a contracted grant researcher for the County, reviewed potential grant opportunities to address some of the needs. Staff then prioritized projects to recommend for funding that met the program objectives and the program criteria of project need, one-time cost, project readiness, feasibility, and limited alternative sources of funding. The projects recommended for funding were presented to and approved by the Board of Supervisors on September 26, 2017.

Farmworker Outreach Program

Agency: Rise, Inc.

Amount Awarded: \$150,000

Project:

This funding will be utilized on an interim basis for a full time position at Rise, Inc. that will serve as a coordinator for farmworker outreach. The position will reinstate the Viva la Vida farmworker conference events (approx. 2 per year), create and facilitate a collaborative of organizations that serve farmworkers, build upon and assist in implementation of the County's Agricultural Labor Report action plan through the collaborative, and work with the collaborative to direct outreach to farms regarding available services for farmworkers. Rise, Inc. is in the process of obtaining grant funding for the position. This funding will be provided for the first and second year (\$75,000 per year) until grant funding is obtained.



Rural Sheriff Presence/Community Policing Program

Agency: Yolo County Sheriff's Office

Amount Awarded: \$90,000

Project:

During the outreach to the communities, a continuous request was made for increased sheriff presence, similar to the resident deputy that used to be provided in the rural areas. Initial estimates from the Sheriff's Office for increased rural presence was \$90,000 for a deputy to patrol for 8 hours three days a week. The deputy will cover the Yolo, Zamora and Dunnigan areas. This funding will pilot increased Sheriff presence for one year, with future funding potentially provided through cannabis enforcement revenue.



Illegal Dumping Mitigation in Clarksburg

Agency: Yolo County Sheriff's Office

Amount Awarded: \$30,000

Project:

The Clarksburg Community Action Plan calls for cameras at various locations in the community to assist in prosecution of theft, dumping and other criminal activities. Potential sites included the Fremont Bridge, Jefferson Blvd, and Sutter Slough Bridge. The Sheriff's Office applied for a grant to obtain 12 cameras to be placed at various locations throughout the County. Two of the cameras will be used to replace cameras currently on the Fremont Bridge while the remaining cameras will be used at other road locations in the County. The \$30,000 awarded will fund two additional cameras to be placed on either Jefferson Blvd or Sutter Slough Bridge in Clarksburg with signage to discourage illegal dumping.



Historic Dunnigan Church Building Restoration

Agency: Union Church of Dunnigan

Amount Awarded: \$50,000

Project:

The Dunnigan Church is a historic building in the town of Dunnigan. A non-profit organization, the Union Church of Dunnigan, was formed to restore the historic building for the community and for public use. The improvement needs include foundation work, window and door restoration, chimney support; lack of public facilities (water, restrooms). The group has begun fundraising efforts to put towards the restoration as well.



Esparto Park and Pool Mitigation

Agency: Yolo County Administrator's Office

Amount Awarded: \$15,000

Project:

The Esparto Park and Pool project is an effort, funded by a state grant, to place a park and pool in the town of Esparto. To begin the project must first mitigate land for Swanson Hawk habitat. Land has been donated for free through gravel operators in the Gravel Program. The funds requested would cover the licensing/permitting fees for the mitigation.



CR 99D Speed Reduction

Agency: Community Services

Installation of flashing speed signs to reduce speeding on CR99D.

Town Halls

Amount Awarded: \$50,000 each

Project:

Funding would assist in remodeling and updating efforts for the community halls/centers in the unincorporated areas.

Guinda Hall: Improvement needs include an upgrade and improvement to foundation, improve west wall, handicap parking spaces, landscaping and improving septic system.

Madison Hall: Improvement needs include asphalt, exterior painting and some internal work.

Rumsey: Improvement needs include emergency door, lighting and some other upgrades to bring building up to County code.

Zamora Hall: Improvement needs include refinishing the parking lot, new bolts and washers on roof, storage for 4-H and firemen, access door, awnings, rain gutters, new ground covering for playground.

Dunnigan Hall: Improvement needs include plumbing repair, roof repair or replacement, and HVAC update.

Clarksburg Historic School House (Public use): The building is currently on stilts on land it must be moved from. The non-profit must purchase land, move the house, and then renovate the building.



Madison Alley Cleanup

Amount Awarded: \$60,000

Project:

Funds would be utilized to remove trees, debris and grade alleys in the Madison community.

Esparto Alley Cleanup

Amount Awarded: \$60,000

Project:

Funds would be utilized to remove trees, debris and grade alleys in the Esparto community.



Esparto Speed Bumps

Amount Awarded: \$40,000

Project:

Installation of four speed bumps along Grafton St.



Knights Landing Drainage

Amount Awarded: \$100,000

Project:

Design and construct a new storm drain in the vicinity of 4th and Railroad streets in the community of Knights Landing. Knights Landing has historically experienced standing water (localized flooding) in the northern portions of town that can be as deep as 2 feet in wet years. The new storm drain would convey storm water to the County's existing drainage system on the east side of Railroad Street. Design and construction are proposed to be completed by Public Works.



Madison Infrastructure Assessment and Grant Applications

Amount Awarded: \$50,000

Project:

Prepare assessment of Madison community drinking water and wastewater systems and submit application for SWRCB DWSRF (water) and/or similar (wastewater) planning grant to design replacement/improvements to both systems. Assessment shall include prioritization of critical issues, including upsizing, redundancy, and adequate fire suppression flows. Planning application shall include preparation of engineers report to support future Prop 218 elections for long term O&M of upgraded systems.



CSA/CSD Archives Digitization

Amount Awarded: \$25,000

Project:

Digitization of key records for CSAs, and other County Service districts.



Library Chromebooks and Mobile Hotspots

Amount Awarded: \$50,000

Project:

Purchase of 40 hotspots (including a 3 year data plan) and 6 Chromebooks for use at the Yolo, Esparto, Winters, Knights Landing and Clarksburg libraries. The library would match the funding with an additional 4 Chromebooks. Overall this project would add an additional 8 hotspots and 2 Chromebooks to the 5 rural libraries. This will assist in providing internet and computer resources for rural areas that are limited in those services.



HHSA Service Kiosks

Amount Awarded: \$30,000

Project:

Purchase service kiosks to be placed at 4 rural libraries in Yolo County including Esparto, Clarksburg, Knights Landing and Yolo. These kiosks would be used to allow Yolo County residents to screen for benefit access, apply for benefits, check their active case or interact with workers at HHSA offices. They could also be programmed to include other resources like 211 or other County Services. This project would be beneficial to residents in the rural areas that may lack transportation or access to HHSA's central offices in Woodland, West Sacramento, Winters and soon Davis. The cost includes \$10,000 towards O&M.



OES Wildland Fire Response Plan

Amount Awarded: \$40,000

Project:

Fund the development of a Wildland Fire response plan, for up near Winters (in the area that has had frequent fire). This would include a response map and recommendations on mitigation measures. It is envisioned that this response plan would be modeled after one conducted in Napa County.
